CHAPTER 458—S. F. No. 1258

An act relating to intoxicating liquors; regulations pertaining to the sale thereof; amending Minnesota Statutes 1967, Section 340.14, Subdivision 2.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1967, Section 340.14, Subdivision 2, is amended to read:

Subd. 2. **Intoxicating liquors; employment of minors; restrictions.** No "on-sale" place of business shall be permitted to have swinging doors or opaque windows. All sales shall be made in full view of the public. Every licensee shall be responsible for the conduct of his place of business and for conditions of sobriety and order therein. No licensee shall keep, possess, or operate, or permit the keeping, possession, or operation of, on the licensed premises, or in any room adjoining the licensed premises, any slot machine, dice, or any gambling device or apparatus, nor permit any gambling therein, nor permit the licensed premises or any room in the same, or in any adjoining building, directly or indirectly under its control to be used as a resort for prostitutes or other disorderly persons. No person under 21 years of age shall be employed in any rooms constituting the place in which intoxicating liquors are sold at retail "on-sale", *except that persons under 21 years of age may be employed to perform the duties of a busboy or dishwashing services in places defined as a restaurant or hotel or motel serving food in rooms in which intoxicating liquors are sold at retail "on-sale"*. No pool table or billiard table shall be kept or used in any "on-sale" premises except a club.
