

sue its debentures payable from income either unsecured or secured by pledge of revenues to be derived from the operation of its property or from other sources, or both, and to agree, if in consonance with national policy, that income derived from property conveyed to it by federal authority in excess of costs of repair, rehabilitation, restoration, and maintenance will be used by it only for park or recreational purposes, and to fulfill such agreement; and in its corporate discretion to use any such excess income which has not been so committed for park or recreation purposes, or for educational purposes by supporting educational institutions or activity, or for both of such purposes, and generally to do any and all lawful acts necessary or appropriate to carry out the purposes for which it is created.

Subd. 5. Subdivision 4 takes the place of Laws 1971, Chapter 605, Section 6, Clause (l), which clause is hereby repealed.

**CHAPTER 4—S.F.No. 12**

*An act relating to salaries of judges in certain municipal courts and the effective date of county court reorganization; amending Minnesota Statutes 1969, Section 488.21, Subdivision 2; Section 488A.19, Subdivision 10; and Section 488A.66, Subdivision 1; amending Extra Session Laws 1967, Chapter 29, Section 2, Subdivision 7 as amended by Laws 1969, Chapter 814, Section 1; Laws 1967, Chapter 792, Section 2, Subdivision 8, as amended by Laws 1969, Chapter 1008, Section 2; and Laws 1969, Chapter 748, Section 2, Subdivision 7 and Laws 1971, Chapter 951, Section 45.*

Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 1969, Section 488A.66, Subdivision 1, is amended to read:

**488A.66 SALARIES: DULUTH MUNICIPAL COURT.** Subdivision 1. Effective January 1, 1971, each judge of the municipal court of the city of Duluth shall be paid an annual salary of ~~\$20,000~~ \$24,000 in semimonthly installments out of the treasury of the city of Duluth. If a judge dies while in office the amount of his salary remaining unpaid for the month in which his death occurs shall be paid to his estate.

Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 1969, Section 488A.19, Subdivision 10, is amended to read:

**Subd. 10. SALARIES: ST. PAUL MUNICIPAL COURT.** Each judge shall be paid an annual salary of ~~\$22,000~~ \$26,000 in biweekly installments out of the treasury of the city of Saint Paul. If a judge dies, the amount of his salary remaining unpaid for the month in which his death occurs shall be paid to his estate.

Sec. 4. Extra Session Laws 1967, Chapter 29, Section 2, Subdivision 7, as amended by Laws 1969, Chapter 814, Section 1, is amended to read:

**Subd. 7. ANOKA COUNTY MUNICIPAL COURT; SALARIES.** Each judge shall be paid an annual salary of ~~\$20,000~~ \$24,000 in semimonthly installments out of the treasury of the county of Anoka. If a judge dies while in office, the amount of his salary remaining unpaid for the month in which his death occurs shall be paid to his estate.

Subd. 7. **SALARIES: CARVER COUNTY MUNICIPAL JUDGE.** The judge shall be paid an annual salary of ~~\$18,000~~ \$19,500 in semimonthly installments out of the treasury of the county of Carver. If the judge dies while in office, the amount of his salary remaining unpaid for the month in which his death occurs shall be paid to his estate.

Sec. 6. Laws 1967, Chapter 792, Section 2, Subdivision 8, as amended by Laws 1969, Chapter 1008, Section 2, is amended to read:

Subd. 8. **SALARIES; WASHINGTON COUNTY MUNICIPAL JUDGE.** A judge shall be paid an annual salary of ~~\$22,000~~ \$24,000 in semi-monthly installments out of the treasury of the county of Washington. If a judge dies while in office, the amount of his salary remaining unpaid for the month in which his death occurs shall be paid to his estate.

Sec. 7. **SALARIES; SCOTT AND DAKOTA COUNTY MUNICIPAL COURTS.** Subdivision 1. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the judge of Dakota county shall be paid an annual salary of \$24,000 in semi-monthly installments out of the treasury of said county. In Scott county the salary shall be \$19,500. If a judge dies while in office, the amount of his salary remaining unpaid for the month in which his death occurs shall be paid to his estate.

Subd. 2. This section is effective on the effective date of any law establishing a full-time county municipal court in Scott or Dakota counties.

Sec. 8. This act is effective on July 1, 1971.

Sec. 9. Laws 1971, Chapter 951, Section 45, is amended to read:

Sec. 45. ~~This act is effective July 1, 1971 in the county court district consisting of Blue Earth county.~~ This act shall be effective immediately upon final enactment for the county court district consisting of Marshall, Red Lake and Pennington counties. In all other county court districts this act is effective July 1, 1972. However, the effective date of this act may be advanced to any date not prior to July 1, 1971 for any county court district upon the concurrence of all the county boards in such district.
