registrar at cost. All other motor vehicles shall be registered and display tax exempt number plates which shall be furnished by the registrar at cost. All vehicles required to display tax exempt number plates shall have the name of the state department or public subdivision on the vehicle plainly printed on both sides thereof in letters not less than 21/2 inches high, one inch wide and of a % inch stroke; except that each state hospital and institution for the mentally ill and mentally retarded may have one vehicle without the required printing on the sides of the vehicle. Such printing shall be in a color giving a marked contrast with that of the part of the vehicle on which it is placed and shall be done with a good quality of paint that will endure throughout the term of the registration. The printing must be on a part of the vehicle itself and not on a removable plate or placard of any kind and shall be kept clean and visible at all times. The owner of any such vehicle desiring to come under the foregoing exemption provisions shall first notify the chief of the state trunk highway patrol who shall provide suitable seals and cause the same to be affixed to any such vehicle.

An act relating to transportation; appropriating money to the public service commission for the purpose of contracting for railroad passenger service.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. RAILROADS; CONTRACTS FOR PASSENGER SERVICE; APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated to the public service commission from the general fund the sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be required for the purpose of contracting with the National Railroad Passenger Corporation for the provision of railroad passenger service within the state pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Sections 216A.10 to 216A.13, during the biennium beginning July 1, 1973.
