

CHAPTER 56—H.F.No.572

An act relating to highway traffic regulations; projecting loads; lights and flags; amending Minnesota Statutes 1971, Section 169.52.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1971, Section 169.52, is amended to read:

169.52 TRAFFIC REGULATIONS; PROJECTING LOADS; LIGHTS AND FLAGS. When the load upon any vehicle extends to the rear four feet or more beyond the bed or body of such vehicle there shall be displayed at the extreme rear end of the load, at the times when lighted lamps on vehicles are required in this chapter, a red light or lantern plainly visible from a distance of at least 500 feet to the sides and rear. The light or lantern required under this section shall be in addition to the rear light required upon every vehicle. At any time when no lights are required there shall be displayed at the extreme rear end of such load a red, yellow or orange flag or cloth not less than 16 inches square.

CHAPTER 57—H.F.No.657

An act relating to certain cities and villages; per diem of members of governing bodies; amending Minnesota Statutes 1971, Section 415.10.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1971, Section 415.10, is amended to read:

415.10 CITIES AND VILLAGES; PER DIEM FOR CERTAIN GOVERNING BODIES. The governing body of any city or village in which the assessed valuation consists in part of iron ore, taconite or semi-taconite may pay the members of such governing body a per diem in an amount not to exceed ~~\$15~~ \$25 per day nor ~~\$75~~ \$250 per year for members of such governing body who are absent from
