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**RESOLUTION 4—H.F.No.34**

*A resolution urging Amtrak to restore St. Paul as a regular passenger stop.*

WHEREAS, the city of St. Paul is a very large commercial and industrial center; and

WHEREAS, the city of St. Paul is the capitol of Minnesota and center of governmental administration; and

WHEREAS, the city of St. Paul is a crew change stop for the national passenger railway system; and

WHEREAS, the city of St. Paul has ample facilities for passenger exchange; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota that Amtrak, the National Railroad Passenger Corporation, be urged to restore St. Paul as a regular railroad passenger stop.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State of Minnesota transmit copies of this resolution to the board of directors of the National Railroad Passenger Corporation, the United States Secretary of Transportation and the Minnesota Senators and Representatives in Congress.

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**RESOLUTION 5—H.F.No.479**

*A resolution memorializing the Congress of the United States to propose a constitutional amendment affirming and protecting the value of human life.*

WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court has recently put on the United States Constitution a construction that is contradictory to the convictions of the people of the United States about the value of human life; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota that the Congress of the United States should speedily propose to the states for their ratification an amendment to the United States Constitution substantially in the following form:

“Article . . . .

Section 1. No person shall be deprived of life, liberty, or property, from conception until natural death without due process of law, nor denied the equal protection of the laws; provided that this article shall not prevent medical operations necessary to save the life of a mother.

Sec. 2. The Congress and the several states shall have concurrent power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.”

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota transmit copies of this resolution to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the President of the United States Senate, the chairmen of the Judiciary Committees of the United States House of Representatives and Senate and the Minnesota Representatives and Senators in Congress.

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**RESOLUTION 6—S.F.No.454**

*A resolution memorializing the President and Congress to provide by law that industries may not move operations to escape environmental protection legislation.*

WHEREAS, preservation and protection of the environment is of great concern to Minnesotans; and

WHEREAS, preservation and protection of the environment is a legitimate state concern; and

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota and other states have enacted laws and regulations designed to preserve and protect their environment; and
