
CHAPTER 172—H.F.No.2683**[Not Coded]**

An act relating to claims against the state; appropriating moneys for the payment thereof.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. **CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE.** Subdivision 1. There is appropriated from the general fund in the state treasury the sums of money set forth in this section to the persons named therein in full and final payment of claims against the state.

Subd. 2. William E. Sunderland, 5261 Jersey Avenue North, Minneapolis, MN 55428, for damages and injuries resulting from the fracture of a hip while a patient at the university of Minnesota hospitals.....\$2,627.97

Subd. 3. Orville Knutson, Rural Route 1, Windom, MN 56101, for loss due to depopulation of cattle to eliminate brucellosis.....\$10,000

Subd. 4. Jamie Porter, 1415 East Franklin Ave., Minneapolis, MN 55404, for damages resulting from an erroneous commitment to the correctional institution for women at Shakopee.....\$15,000

Subd. 3. Earl R. Colstrup, Route 2, Box 278, Albert Lea, MN 56007, for crop loss in 1975 resulting from highway construction on I-90.....\$1,140

Subd. 4. Jerome W. and Bernadette A. Bergeron, 3191 Karth Road, White Bear Lake, MN 55110, for personal property damage resulting from flooding due to highway construction.....\$3,000

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. **[144A.01] PUBLIC HEALTH; NURSING HOMES; REGULATIONS; DEFINITIONS.** Subdivision 1. For the purposes of sections 1 to 28 of this act, the terms defined in this section have the meanings given them.

Subd. 2. "Board of health" means the state board of health established by Minnesota Statutes, Section 144.01.

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
