CHAPTER 1—S.F.No.110

An act relating to the operation of state government; authorizing the governor to temporarily alter or adjust state work and compensation practices in order to minimize state government's energy consumption.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. ENERGY EMERGENCY; GUBERNATORIAL POWERS; EMERGENCY WORK SCHEDULES. In light of the current energy emergency in the state of Minnesota and notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the governor, is hereby empowered, from January 18, 1977, to April 1, 1977, to alter or adjust by executive order the working hours, work days and work week of, and annual and sick leave provisions and payroll laws regarding all state employees in the executive branch as he deems necessary to minimize state government's energy consumption. Such alterations or adjustments shall not be subject to sections 15.0411 through 15.052. Any alterations or adjustments to the extent practicable shall conform to existing state laws, rules and collective bargaining agreements.

Sec. 2. This act is effective the day following final enactment and shall expire April 2, 1977.
