Every boiler or pressure vessel as to which any insurance company authorized to do business in this state has issued a policy of insurance, after the inspection thereof, is exempt from inspection made under sections 183.375 to 183.58, while the same continues to be insured and the person, firm, or corporation owning or operating the same has an unexpired certificate of exemption from inspection, issued by the chief boiler inspector upon receipt of the exemption fee of \$3 \$4 for each object. A certificate of exemption expires one year from date of issue. The certificate of exemption shall be posted in a conspicuous place near the boiler or pressure vessel described therein and to which it relates. Every insurance company shall give written notice to the chief boiler inspector of the cancellation or expiration of every policy of insurance issued by it with reference to policies in this state, and the cause or reason for the cancellation or expiration. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

- Section 1. INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICTS NOS. 272 AND 273; TRANSFER OF TERRITORY. All that part of Independent School District No. 272 lying north of the north line of the south 1/2 of the north 1/2 of section 7, township 116, range 21 and east of the center line of County Road No. 18 and lying within the city of Edina is hereby detached from Independent School District No. 272, whose principal office is at Eden Prairie, and is annexed to Independent School District No. 273, whose principal office is at Edina.
- Sec. 2. The property described in section 1 shall remain subject to taxation for all bonded indebtedness of Independent School District No. 272 outstanding on the effective date of this act, and shall not become subject to taxation for any bonded indebtedness of Independent School District No. 273 outstanding on the effective date of this act. However, such property shall not be subject to taxation for payment of principal or interest on state loans granted or to be granted to Independent School District No. 272.
- Sec. 3. This act shall become effective upon its approval by resolutions adopted by a majority of all members of the school board of Independent School District No. 272 and by a majority of all members of the school board of Independent School District No. 273, and upon compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

- Subd. 2. SALARIES. (1) Each employee other than the chief supervisor, lieutenant colonel, majors, captains, corporals and sergeants hereinafter designated shall be known as patrol troopers.
- (2) There may be appointed one lieutenant colonel; and such majors, captains, corporals, sergeants and troopers as the commissioner deems necessary to carry out the duties and functions of the highway patrol. Persons in above named positions shall be appointed by law and have such duties as the commissioner may direct and, except for troopers, shall be selected from the patrol troopers, corporals, sergeants, captains, and majors who shall have had at least five years' experience as either patrol troopers, corporals, sergeants, or supervisors.
