(2) An applicant for a Class B journeyman electrician's license shall have had at least two years of experience, acceptable to the board, in wiring for, installing, and repairing electrical wiring, apparatus, or equipment; provided, however, that the board may by rule provide for the allowance of one year of experience credit for successful completion of a two-year post high school electrical course approved by the board. No Class B journeyman's license shall be valid except in regard to single phase systems, not over 200 amperes in capacity, on farmsteads or in single family dwellings located in towns or municipalities with fewer than 2500 inhabitants.

CHAPTER 64 — H.F.No. 420

An act relating to the bureau of criminal apprehension; including the superintendent within workers' compensation coverage; amending Minnesota Statutes 1980, Section 299C.19.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1980, Section 299C.19, is amended to read:

299C.19 EMPLOYEES INCLUDED IN WORKERS' COMPENSATION LAWS.

Every employee of the bureau, ~~except the superintendent,~~ shall be deemed an employee of the state within the meaning of the workers' compensation laws of this state and entitled to the benefit of all the provisions of those laws applicable to state employees.

CHAPTER 65 — H.F.No. 518

An act relating to education; including state institutions as eligible employers for the purpose of work-study grants; amending Minnesota Statutes 1980, Section 136A.233, Subdivision 2.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1980, Section 136A.233, Subdivision 2, is amended to read:

Subd. 2. For purposes of sections 136A.231 to 136A.235, the following words have the meanings ascribed to them:

(a) "Eligible student" means a Minnesota resident enrolled or intending to enroll full time in a Minnesota post-secondary institution.

(b) "Financial need" means the need for financial assistance in order to attend a post-secondary institution as determined by a post-secondary institution according to guidelines established by the higher education coordinating board.

(c) "Eligible employer" means any eligible post-secondary institution and any nonprofit, nonsectarian agency or state institution located in the state of Minnesota, including state hospitals, and also includes a handicapped person or a person over 65 who employs a student to provide personal services in or about the residence of the handicapped person or the person over 65.

(d) "Eligible post-secondary institution" means any post-secondary institution eligible for participation in the Minnesota state scholarship and grant program as specified in section 136A.101, subdivision 4.

CHAPTER 66 — S.F.No. 196

An act relating to Carver county; providing for payment of expenses of the county commissioners.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. EXPENSE ACCOUNTS.

Each member of the board of county commissioners of Carver county shall be allowed a sum to be paid in equal monthly installments as an expense account. The amount shall be set by the board for each commissioner district.

Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This act is effective the day after compliance by the governing body of Carver county with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021, Subdivision 3.
