However, editorial changes to the text are limited to the correction of misspelled words, the correction of manifest clerical and grammatical errors, and the assignment or changes in the assignment of preliminary statutory coding to general and permanent laws. The power to make these changes is given to the revisor in Minnesota Statutes, section 648.34, subdivision 1.

Headnotes in **BOLDFACE TYPE** are informational notes for the chapter, section, or subdivision in which they appear but are not part of the law.

Strike outs indicate matter deleted by amendment to an existing provision of law.

<u>Underline</u> indicates new matter inserted by amendment to an existing provision of law.

The section numbers in brackets [26.12] are preliminary numbers assigned to new sections that will be included in the next edition of Minnesota Statutes. The final assignment of numbers will be listed in tables in the next edition of Minnesota Statutes.

1982 THIRD SPECIAL SESSION LAWS of the STATE OF MINNESOTA

Enacted by the Seventy-Second Legislature at the Third 1982 Special Session, December 7 to December 10, 1982

PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, The national economy is experiencing a serious recession, marked by high unemployment and reduced levels of activity in all sectors of the economy; and
- WHEREAS, The continuation of the national recession has resulted in reduced spending by Minnesota consumers and depressed levels of manufacturing and sales by Minnesota corporations, thus causing revenues generated by the personal income, sales and corporate income taxes to be significantly lower than previously estimated; and
- WHEREAS, It is estimated that the national recession will continue and will cause a projected deficit of \$312.5 million in the State budget for the biennium ending on June 30, 1983; and
- WHEREAS, It is necessary that immediate steps be taken to balance the State budget for the current biennium in accordance with State law, thereby creating an extraordinary occasion; and
- WHEREAS, Article IV, Section 12 of the Constitution of the State of Minnesota provides that a special session of the Legislature may be called in extraordinary occasions;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby summon you, members of the Legislature, to convene in special session on Tuesday, December 7, 1982, at 10:00 a.m. in the forenoon at the Capitol in Saint Paul.

I urge the Legislature to act expeditiously to adopt a responsible budget-balancing program.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed this sixth day of December in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred Eighty-Two and of the State the One Hundred Twenty-Fourth.
