CHAPTER 370—S.F.No. 1515

An act relating to Ramsey county; authorizing the issuance of bonds for the construction of library buildings and an annual levy for debt retirement; providing for an appointed county abstract clerk; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 383A; repealing Minnesota Statutes 1984, section 383A.38.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. [383A.381] ABSTRACT CLERK.

In Ramsey county the office of abstract clerk shall not be elective but be filled by procedures adopted by the county personnel department and shall discharge the functions provided by the county. The last abstract clerk elected shall serve in a position created by the county to perform the functions of the office until the elected term expires or, upon the expiration of the term, until a successor is appointed and qualified and shall not before age 70 be disqualified from appointment because of age.

Sec. 2. TAX.

The Ramsey county board may levy a tax on taxable property within the county outside of the city of St. Paul to acquire, better, and construct county library buildings and equipment and to pay principal and interest on bonds issued for that purpose. The tax shall be disregarded in the calculation of levies or limits on levies provided by Minnesota Statutes, sections 275.50 to 275.56, or other law.

Sec. 3. AUTHORIZATION.

The Ramsey county board may issue and sell general obligation bonds of the county in the amount of \$15,000,000 in the manner provided in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 475, to acquire, better, and construct county library buildings and equipment. The county board shall prescribe the form of the bonds and their interest rate and sell them to the highest bidder after publication of the notice of the time and place for receiving of the bids. The bonds may be issued without the submission of the question of their issuance to the voters. The bonds shall not be subject to the requirements of Minnesota Statutes, sections 475.57 to 475.59. When the tax levy authorized in section 2 is collected, it shall be appropriated and credited to a debt service fund for the bonds. The tax levy for the debt service fund required by Minnesota Statutes, section 475.61, shall be reduced by the amount available or reasonably anticipated to be available in the fund to make payments otherwise payable from the levy required by section 475.61.

Sec. 4. REPEALER.

Minnesota Statutes 1984, section 383A.38, is repealed.

Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This act takes effect the day after the filing of a certificate of local approval by the Ramsey county board in compliance with Minnesota Statutes, section 645.021, subdivision 3.

CHAPTER 371—S.F.No. 1580

An act relating to human services; requiring adoption of the 1985 life safety code standards for intermediate care facilities for persons with mental retardation.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. LIFE SAFETY REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERMEDIATE CARE FACILITIES FOR PERSONS WITH MENTAL RETARDATION.

Notwithstanding any other law, the state fire marshal and the commissioners of health and human services shall adopt the applicable standards of the 1985 life safety code, and amend existing rules governing life safety to be consistent with the 1985 code, for intermediate care facilities for persons with mental retardation, to the extent allowed by federal statute or rule. The standards and amendments to the standards shall be adopted without rulemaking and are effective 30 days following publication in the State Register.

Sec. 2. SUNSET.

Section 1 is repealed June 30, 1987, or when rules incorporating the 1985 life safety code have been adopted, whichever occurs first.

Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This act is effective the day following final enactment.

CHAPTER 372—S.F.No. 1619
