CHAPTER 537-S.F.No. 2191

An act relating to animals; modifying regulations of kennels and dealers of certain animals used for research purposes; amending Minnesota Statutes 1987 Supplement, sections 347.31, subdivision 4; and 347.37.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1987 Supplement, section 347.31, subdivision 4, is amended to read:

Subd. 4. DEALER. "Dealer" means a public or private agency, person, society, or corporation that is licensed or is required to be licensed as a "Class B dealer" under United States Code, title 7, sections 2131 to 2155, as amended through December 31, 1986, who sells or transfers dogs or cats to institutions or to other dealers who sell or transfer to institutions.

Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 1987 Supplement, section 347.37, is amended to read:

347.37 PUBLIC ACCESS; NOTICE; INSPECTION; ENFORCEMENT.

The board of animal health shall cause to be inspected from time to time all kennels and dealers licensed hereunder and all records required by sections 347.31 to 347.40 to be kept by the licensees.

Any duly authorized agent of the board, any sheriff, or sheriff's deputy, or police officer, or humane agent appointed pursuant to section 343.01 is granted the power and the authority to enter upon the premises of any kennel or dealer at any time during the daylight hours for the purposes herein set forth, and for the purposes of inspecting the compliance with the provisions of sections 346.55, 347.31 to 347.40 and the rules issued pursuant thereto, and for the purposes of enforcing sections 346.55, or 347.31 to 347.40; except that humane agents shall not enter upon the premises of a licensed veterinarian acting as a kennel.

Each kennel and dealer shall post a conspicuous notice in a format no less than 24 by 36 inches and easily readable by the general public, that states: (1) that the person is a licensed kennel or dealer in dogs and cats; (2) that dogs and cats left with the kennel or dealer may be used for research purposes; and (3) the hours the kennel or dealer is open to the public. The notice must be placed in at least two locations on the premises, one of which must be on or near the

exterior mail delivery point and one of which must be at the regularly used point of exchange of dogs and cats. A person may view dogs and cats in the custody of a kennel or dealer during the time the premises is open to the public. Dealers and kennels are required to be open to the public on a regular basis at least four hours between 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. on at least four of the seven days of each week including at least one Saturday or Sunday. Any advertisement placed by a kennel or dealer seeking dogs or cats must inform the public that dogs and cats brought to the kennel or dealer may be used for research purposes.

CHAPTER 538-H.F.No. 1585

An act relating to natural resources; designating a basin of Twin Lake within the city of Robbinsdale as a separate basin, South Twin Lake.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. SOUTH TWIN LAKE.

<u>The south water basin of Twin Lake in Hennepin county, lying east of state</u> <u>trunk highway No. 100, that is located entirely within the city of Robbinsdale is</u> <u>a separate water basin and lake to be known as South Twin Lake. South Twin</u> <u>Lake shall be given a separate public waters inventory number.</u>

CHAPTER 539-H.F.No. 1831

An act relating to intoxicating liquor; authorizing issuance of one on-sale liquor license on an excursion and dinner boat on Detroit Lake, Becker county; authorizing issuance of an on-sale liquor license to Fort Snelling.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. BECKER COUNTY EXCURSION BOAT LIQUOR LICENSE.

The county of Becker may, with the approval of the commissioner of public safety, issue one on-sale license for the sale of intoxicating liquor on an excursion and dinner boat operated on Detroit Lake and having a capacity of 100 or more passengers. The license shall permit the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages only while the boat is under way or moored or anchored offshore. The annual license fee shall be set by the county board. Chapter 340A shall govern the issuance of the license and the sale, purchase, and consumption of alcoholic beverages thereunder to the extent consistent with this section.

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
