

**CHAPTER 347—H.F.No. 2115**

*An act relating to agriculture; adjusting certain net worth definitions for certain rural finance agency programs; amending Minnesota Statutes 1994, section 41C.02, subdivision 12.*

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1994, section 41C.02, subdivision 12, is amended to read:

Subd. 12. **LOW OR MODERATE NET WORTH.** "Low or moderate net worth" means:

(1) for an individual, an aggregate net worth of the individual and the individual's spouse and minor children of less than \$200,000 in 1991 and an amount in subsequent years which is adjusted for inflation by multiplying \$200,000 by the cumulative inflation rate as determined by the United States All-Items Consumer Price Index; or

(2) for a partnership, an aggregate net worth of all partners, including each partner's net capital in the partnership, and each partner's spouse and minor children of less than \$400,000 in 1991 and an amount in subsequent years which is adjusted for inflation by multiplying \$400,000 by the cumulative inflation rate as determined by the United States All-Items Consumer Price Index. However, the aggregate net worth of each partner and that partner's spouse and minor children may not exceed \$200,000 in 1991 and an amount in subsequent years which is adjusted for inflation by multiplying \$200,000 by the cumulative inflation rate as determined by the United States All-Items Consumer Price Index.

Sec. 2. **EFFECTIVE DATE.**

Section 1 is effective the day following final enactment.

*An act relating to state government; providing for a representative of organized labor on the pollution control agency board; amending Minnesota Statutes 1995 Supplement, section 116.02, subdivision 1.*

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1995 Supplement, section 116.02, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

Subdivision 1. A pollution control agency, designated as the Minnesota pollution control agency, is hereby created. The agency shall consist of the commissioner and eight

members appointed by the governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate. One of such members shall be a person knowledgeable in the field of agriculture and one shall be representative of organized labor.

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1994, section 469.068, is amended by adding a subdivision to read:

Subd. 3. **UNIFORM MUNICIPAL CONTRACTING LAW.** A port authority may use the dollar limits on contracts for the basis for competitive bids, quotations, or purchase or sale in the open market contained in section 471.345 as an alternative to the limits contained in subdivision 1.
