

CHAPTER 19—S.F.No. 9

An act relating to local government; authorizing cities to provide housing assistance to secure fire and ambulance service; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 412.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. [412.153] EXPENDITURES FOR PUBLIC SAFETY PERSONNEL HOUSING ASSISTANCE.

Statutory cities may expend public funds to acquire or lease residential property for housing or otherwise provide housing assistance in the city for one or more volunteer firefighters or ambulance personnel. The expenditure may only be made to attract and retain the qualified personnel necessary to ensure that a city has timely public safety and related service. A city may make the expenditure only after the need for the expenditure has been established and approved at a public hearing.

Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.

Section 1 is effective the day following final enactment.

CHAPTER 20—S.F.No. 971

An act relating to crimes; repealing law which prohibits holding itinerant carnivals; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 624.65.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. REPEALER.

Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 624.65, is repealed.

An act relating to towns; repealing a provision about certain male animals or breachy cattle; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 346.19.

Section 1. **REPEALER.**

Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 346.19, is repealed.

CHAPTER 22—S.F.No. 972

An act relating to crimes; repealing the law prohibiting endurance contests and striking a reference to it in law; amending Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 375.40; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 624.66.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 375.40, is amended to read:

375.40 COUNTY BOARD MAY LICENSE EXHIBITIONS AND SHOWS.

A county board may license and regulate itinerant shows, carnivals, circuses, endurance contests, and exhibitions of any nature whatsoever, ~~except those prohibited by section 624.66.~~ Sections 375.40 to 375.42 do not apply to shows, carnivals, circuses, contests, and exhibitions held within the incorporated limits of a city.

The fee for a license shall be fixed by the county board in the amount it deems advisable.

The board may require, as a condition for granting the license, the posting of a penal bond in the amount it shall determine.

Application for a license shall be made on the form the county board determines. Upon approval of an application and the payment of the license fee and the posting of the required bond, the county auditor shall issue the license.

Sec. 2. **REPEALER.**

Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 624.66, is repealed.
