

CHAPTER 374—S. F. No. 907.

An act to amend Section 38 of Chapter 323, Laws 1921, relating to the appropriation and expenditure of moneys by villages, boroughs, cities of the fourth class and townships for the improvement and maintenance of roads, bridges and ferries.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Municipalities may appropriate money for improvement of ferries.—That section 38 of chapter 323, Laws 1921, be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:

"Section 38. The council of any village, borough or of any city of the fourth class or the town board of any town, may appropriate and expend such reasonable sums as it may deem proper to assist in the improvement and maintenance of roads lying beyond its boundaries and leading into it, and of *ferries and bridges* thereon whether they are within or without the county in which it is situated. Such municipalities may also engage in the manufacture of crushed rock for use on public highways and said crushed rock may be conveyed, by gift or sale, to other municipalities for such use.

CHAPTER 375—S. F. No. 963.

An act to amend Section 1 of Chapter 365, Laws 1909, entitled: "An act to authorize and empower cities of the state of Minnesota to annually appropriate and expend not to exceed \$300 for the appropriate observance of memorial day", by increasing the amount which may be so appropriated and expended.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Municipalities may appropriate money for observance of Memorial Day.—That section 1 of chapter 365, Laws 1909, the same being section 1382, General Statutes 1913, be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:

"1382. The city council or common council of each and every city in the state of Minnesota, in addition to all other powers now possessed by it, is hereby empowered and authorized to set apart, appropriate and expend, or cause to be expended, in such manner as it may deem best, from any funds in the city treasury available therefor, an amount not to exceed the sum of *three* hundred dollars annually for each 75,000 of population of such city for the purpose of aiding in the appropriate observance of Memorial Day on the 30th of May of each year and in the annual commemoration of the noble and valiant deeds of the nation's soldier dead."
