

CHAPTER 436—H. F. No. 954

An act relating to neglected and delinquent children; amending Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 260.27.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 260.27, is amended to read:

260.27 Parents, guardians; responsibility. *Any person who by act, word or omission encourages, causes or contributes to the neglect or delinquency of a child, and such act, word or omission is not by other provisions of law declared to be a felony, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.*

CHAPTER 437—H. F. No. 998

An act relating to the practice of dentistry; amending Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 150.04, Subdivision 1 as amended.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 150.04, Subdivision 1, as amended by Laws 1951, Chapter 307, is amended to read:

150.04 Licenses. Subdivision 1. Applications, examinations. A person not already a licensed dentist of the state, desiring to practice dentistry therein, shall apply to the secretary-treasurer of the state board of dental examiners for examination and pay a fee of \$25 for the first examination, and \$25 for each subsequent examination, which in no case shall be refunded. At the next regular meeting he may present himself for examination and produce his diploma from some dental college of good standing, of which standing the board shall be the judge, also satisfactory evidence showing that the applicant is of good moral character. Every applicant for a license to practice dentistry, whether by examination or reciprocity, shall produce evidence satisfactory to the board that he is a citizen of the United States. The board shall give the applicant such an elementary examination as to thoroughly test his fitness for the practice and include therein the subject of anatomy, physiology, chemistry, materia medica, therapeutics, metallurgy, histology, pathology, and operative surgical and mechanical dentistry; and the applicant will be required to demonstrate his
