An act to provide for the retirement of executive office aides and for compensation upon retirement.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. **Executive office aide, retirement.** When an executive office aide arrives at the age of 70 years and has served the State of Minnesota for 50 years or more, under 14 or more governors, becomes incapacitated for the performance of his official duties to the extent that the public service suffers therefrom, and makes written application to the governor for his retirement, the governor, if he determines that such executive office aide has arrived at such age and has served the state at least 50 years, or that such disability exists, shall direct his retirement by written order, which shall effect a vacancy in the office to be filled as provided by law.
- Sec. 2. Annuity, additional payment. Such executive office aide upon retirement, shall receive in addition to the amount of the monthly annuity to which he is entitled from the state employees retirement fund, an amount to be paid monthly during his lifetime equal to the difference between the amount of his retirement annuity and \$300. Such additional amounts are hereby appropriated from the general revenue fund and shall be paid in the manner all state salaries are paid.

CHAPTER 650—S. F. No. 164

An act to repeal Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 126.06, relating to the bringing of an action against any school district when the trustees of the district have resigned or removed from the district and none are elected or appointed in their stead.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Repealer. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 126.06, is hereby repealed.
