CHAPTER 87-H. F. No. 294

An act relating to liability insurance for cities and school districts; amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 465.62.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 465.62 is amended to read:

465.62 Cities, liability insurance. Subdivision 1. The governing body of any city or school district may procure insurance against liability of the city or school district or of its officers and employees for damages resulting from wrongful acts and omissions of the city or school district and its officers and employees, whether the acts or omissions relate to governmental or proprietary functions of the city or school dis-trict. Any independent board or commission in the city or school district having authority to disburse funds for a particular city or school district function without approval of the council may similarly procure liability insurance with respect to the field of its operation. Insofar as this insurance relates to governmental functions of the city or school district, the policy of insurance shall contain a provision under which the insurance company agrees to waive the defense of governmental immunity unless the city or school district consents to the assertion of that defense. The waiver of defense of governmental immunity made pursuant to such provision in the policy of insurance shall not subject the city or school district to liability in excess of the insurance coverage provided by the policy.

Subd. 2. This section is supplementary to other laws and charter provisions on the same subject.

CHAPTER 88-H. F. No. 422

An act relating to the registration and taxation of motor vehicles owned by non-resident circuses and carnivals and providing for issuance of permits under certain conditions.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. [168.183] Motor vehicles of certain nonresidents. [Subdivision 1.] Payment of taxes. All trucks, truck-tractors, trailers and semi-trailers, which comply with all of the provisions of section 168.181 but are excluded from the exemptions provided therein solely because of the intrastate nature of their movement in this state, owned by nonresidents owning or operating circuses, carnivals or similar amusement attractions or concessions shall be required to comply with all laws and regulations as to the payment of taxes applicable to like vehicles owned by Minnesota residents but such nonresidents may make application to pay such tax for each vehicle proportionate to the number of months or fraction thereof such vehicles are in this state.

Sec. 2. [Subd. 2.] Contents of application. The application shall contain such information and shall be executed in such manner as the registrar may require and shall include a complete itinerary of the applicant and shall be accompanied by such evidence of ownership as the registrar shall deem necessary.

Sec. 3. [Subd. 3] Permit. Upon payment of the required tax the registrar shall issue, in lieu of registration plates, a permit for each vehicle so taxed. The permit shall contain the name and address of the owner, the make, type, serial number and year model of the vehicle, the expiration date and any other information deemed necessary by the registrar. The permit must be carried in the vehicle at all times while being operated in this state.

CHAPTER 89-H. F. No. 763

An act relating to establishment of sewage system in certain towns.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Sewage system in certain towns. In any town of this state having not less than 550, and not more than 600, inhabitants according to the last federal census, and having an assessed valuation of more than \$605,000, and less than \$610,000, and having an area of not less than 22,000, nor more than 23,000, acres, the town board shall have power to establish and maintain a general system of sewers, to create sewer districts, and change, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries thereof, from time to time, and to relay, alter, or extend any existing sewer system and to establish and maintain
