## CHAPTER 134—H. F. No. 425

An act relating to the licensing of steamfitters; providing for a change in fees; amending Minnesota Statutes 1957, Section 326.50.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1957, Section 326.50, is amended to read:

326.50 Applications; fees. Application for a steam-fitter's license shall be made to the Industrial Commission, with fees. Unless the applicant is entitled to a renewal, he shall be licensed only after passing a satisfactory examination by the examiners showing fitness. Fees for journeymen shall be \$10 for examination and \$4 for renewal, and for contracting master steamfitters \$40 for examination and \$30 for renewal. Licenses shall expire December 31, but may be renewed upon application made the following January or February; but, if in February, only upon payment of an additional fee of \$2 for a journeyman and \$10 for a contracting master steamfitter.

Section 2. Section 1 shall take effect from and after July 1, 1959.
