Subd. 2a. Counties local improvements. "Municipality" also includes a county in the case of construction, reconstruction or improvement of a county state-aid highway or county highway including curbs and gutters and storm sewers outside of the boundaries of any city, village or borough.

Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 1967, Section 429.011, Subdivision 3, is amended to read:

Subd. 3. "Council" means the body of the city, village, or borough having general legislative powers or, the town board of the town, or the county board of a county.

Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 1967, Section 429.011, Subdivision 5, is amended to read:

Subd. 5. "Improvement" means any type of improvement made under authority granted by section 429.021, and in the case of a county is limited to the construction, reconstruction, or improvement of a county state-aid highway or county highway including curbs and gutters and storm sewers outside of the boundaries of any city, village, or borough.

609.11 **Crimes; minimum terms of imprisonment.** All commitments to the commissioner of corrections for imprisonment of the defendant are without minimum terms except when sentence is to life imprisonment as required by law and except that any commitment for a felony wherein the intent of the defendant is an element of proof and wherein the defendant had in his possession a firearm at the time of the offense shall be for a term of not less than three years.
