## CHAPTER 427—H.F.No.1692

An act relating to labor and industry; boiler and pressure vessel fees to be paid to the state of Minnesota; amending Minnesota Statutes 1971, Sections 183.545, Subdivisions 3 and 4; and 183.57, Subdivision 2.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1971, Section 183.545, Subdivision 3, is amended to read:

Subd. 3. BOILERS; PRESSURE VESSEL INSPECTION FEES. The fees for the inspection of boilers and pressure vessels are:

Boiler inaccessible for internal inspection, ————— \$10
Boiler accessible for internal inspection, \$15
Pressure vessel accessible for internal inspection,——— \$6
Pressure vessel inaccessible for internal inspection, ——— \$4
Shop inspection for full day $$60-$125$ , one-half day $$35$ , plus mileage.
Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 1971, Section 183.545, Subdivision 4, is amended to read:
Subd. 4. The fee for an examination of an applicant for an engineer's license is:
Chief engineer's license,————— \$15-\$16
First class engineer's license,————— \$10-\$11

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Second class engineer's license,	<del>\$10</del> - <u>\$11</u>
Special engineer's license,———————	<del>\$4</del> - <u>\$5</u>

If an applicant, after an examination, is entitled to receive a license, it shall be issued to him without the payment of any additional charge. Any license so issued expires one year after the date of its issuance. An engineer's license may be renewed upon application therefor and the payment of an annual renewal fee as follows:

Chief engineer's license renewal	<del>\$5</del> - <u>\$6</u>
First class engineer's license renewal—————	<del>\$5</del> - <u>\$6</u>
Second class engineer's license renewal	<b>\$4</b> - <u>\$5</u>
Special engineer's license renewal	<b>\$</b> 3- <u>\$4</u>

The fee is payable at the time of application, which shall be made not later than ten days after the date of expiration of such license. If application is made more than ten days after the date of expiration of such license, an expired fee shall be paid instead of the renewal fee prescribed above; the expired fees are:

First class engineer ————————	<del>\$7</del> - <u>\$8</u>
Second class engineer ————————	<b>\$6-<u>\$7</u></b>

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Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 1971, Section 183.57, Subdivision 2, is amended to read:

Subd. 2. Every boiler or pressure vessel as to which any insurance company authorized to do business in this state has issued a policy of insurance, after the inspection thereof, is exempt from inspection made under sections 183.375 to 183.58, while the same continues to be insured and the person, firm, or corporation owning or operating the same has an unexpired certificate of exemption from inspection, issued by the chief boiler inspector upon receipt of the exemption fee of \$2.\$3 for each object. A certificate of exemption expires one year from date of issue. The certificate of exemption shall be posted in a conspicuous place near the boiler or pressure vessel described therein and to which it relates. Every insurance company shall give written notice to the chief boiler inspector of the cancellation or expiration of every policy of insurance issued by it with reference to policies in this state, and the cause or reason for the cancellation or expiration. These notices of cancellation or expiration shall show the date of the policy and the date when the cancellation has or will become effective.

Sec. 4. This act is effective on the date when the fees imposed by this act become due and payable for the first time after the final enactment of this act.

## CHAPTER 428—H.F.No.1834 [Coded]

An act relating to civil defense; changing the name of the division of civil defense to the division of emergency services; providing for the purchase of excess property by the state for civil defense purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. [12.05] CIVIL DEFENSE; DIVISION OF EMERGENCY SERVICES. The division of civil defense in the department of public safety established by Laws 1969, Chapter 1129, Article 1, Section 14, is hereby renamed the division of emergency services.
