- Sec. 4. The city may levy the taxes required by law for the payment of such bonds and interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount, and the levy of such taxes shall not cause the amount of other taxes, levied or to be levied by the city, which are subject to any such limitation, to be reduced in any amount whatsoever.
- Sec. 5. This act is effective upon its approval by the governing body of the city of Wykoff and upon compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

CHAPTER 23—S.F.No.636

An act relating to motor vehicles; permitting persons 15 years of age to operate a motor vehicle for medical reasons; amending Minnesota Statutes 1974, Chapter 171, by adding a section.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1974, Chapter 171, is amended by adding a section to read:

[171.042] MOTOR VEHICLES; UNDERAGE DRIVER'S LICENSE FOR MEDICAL REASONS. Notwithstanding any provisions of section 171.04, relating to the age of an applicant, the commissioner may issue a driver's license to a person who has attained the age of 15 years but is under the age of 16 years, who, except for his age, is qualified to hold a driver's license and who needs to operate a motor vehicle because of personal or family medical reasons. Applicants shall apply to the commissioner for the license on forms prescribed by the commissioner. The application shall be accompanied by written verified statements by the applicant's parent or guardian and by a doctor setting forth the necessity for the license. The commissioner in issuing such license may impose such conditions and limitations as in his judgment are necessary to the interests of the public safety and welfare.

Sec. 2. This act is effective immediately upon final enactment.
