- Subd. 3. For the issuance and registration of the new <u>first</u> certificate of title there shall be paid to the registrar the sum of two dollars, in addition to any other sum prescribed by law, which shall be disposed of in the manner provided by section 508.75.
- Subd. 4. Upon the original registration of an appurtenant easement over unregistered land there shall be paid to the registrar the sum of five dollars.

## CHAPTER 22—S.F.No.43

An act relating to highway traffic regulations; parking privileges for the physically handicapped; amending Minnesota Statutes 1976, Section 169.345, Subdivisions 2 and 3.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

- Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1976, Section 169.345, Subdivision 2, is amended to read:
- Subd. 2. TRAFFIC REGULATIONS; DEFINITION OF PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED; PARKING. Physically handicapped as employed herein shall include any person who has sustained an amputation or permanent material disability of either or both arms or legs, or who has been otherwise permanently disabled in any manner rendering it difficult and burdensome for him to walk.
- Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 1976, Section 169.345, Subdivision 3, is amended to read:
- Subd. 3. IDENTIFYING CERTIFICATE. The motor vehicles division in the department of public safety shall issue without charge a special identifying certificate or insignia for a marked motor vehicle to any physically handicapped applicant upon submission by the applicant of a certificate by a qualified physician to the division that he is a physically handicapped person within the meaning of subdivision 2.

The commissioner of public safety shall determine the form, size and promulgate rules and regulations governing their issuance and use necessary to carry out the provisions of this section. The physician's certificate shall specify whether the disability is permanent or temporary, and if temporary, the opinion of the physician as to the duration of the disability. The commissioner may issue special identifying certificates or insignia to temporarily physically handicapped persons for limited periods of time.

Sec. 3. This act is effective the day following its final enactment.
