#### CHAPTER 1-H.F.No.1

### [Coded]

An act relating to the legislature; defining "legislative day"; prescribing meeting times; repealing Minnesota Statutes 1971, Section 3.01, Subdivision 1.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. [3.011] LEGISLATURE; SESSIONS. The legislature shall assemble at the seat of government on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in January of each odd numbered year; provided, however, that when the first Monday in January falls on January 1, the legislature shall assemble on the first Wednesday after the first Monday in January of that year; and at such other times as it may be called by the governor to meet in extra session.
- Sec. 2. [3.012] LEGISLATIVE DAY. A legislative day is any day when either house of the legislature is called to order. A legislative day shall commence at seven o'clock a.m. and continue until seven o'clock a.m. of the following calendar day.
- Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 1971, Section 3.01, Subdivision 1, is repealed.
- Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act shall be effective upon final enactment.
