## CHAPTER 116—S. F. No. 608

# [Coded]

An act authorizing certain cities, villages and towns to lease community or municipal hospitals, municipal lands or buildings to non-profit hospital associations; and authorizing the turning over of hospital equipment or supplies to such association, and further authorizing the reimbursement of such association for various expenditures.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

[471.475] Municipalities may lease hospi-The governing body of any city, village or town, the valuation of which consists of more than 25 per cent iron ore may lease, upon such terms as it deems to be in its best interests, whether for a direct monetary consideration or otherwise, any community or municipal hospital, or any lands, or buildings in connection therewith belonging to said city, village or town to any incorporated non-profit hospital association. However, such hospital must be made and kept available to all inhabitants of such city, village or town on equal terms. Any such city, village or town may lease, sell, assign or donate to such hospital association upon such terms as it determines to be in its best interests, whether for monetary consideration or otherwise, any hospital supplies or equipment for use in such hospital, and may reimburse such association for any expenditures made for such hospital supplies out of the general or permanent improvement fund of the city, village or town or out of any special hospital fund which may be created, or out of moneys obtained as gifts for hospital purposes from individuals, corporations, foundations, or groups of any sort.

# CHAPTER 117-S. F. No. 717

An act relating to recreational facilities, to include swimming pools and to authorize the issuance of bonds; amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 471.15.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 471.15, is amended to read:

471.15. Recreational facilities. Any city or any village, borough, town, county, school district, or any board thereof, or any incorporated post of the American Legion or any other incorporated veterans' organization, may operate a program of public recreation and playgrounds; acquire, equip, and maintain land, buildings, or other recreational facilities, including an outdoor or indoor swimming pool; and expend funds for the operation of such program pursuant to the provisions of Sections 471.15 to 471.19. Any such city, village, borough, town, county or school district may issue bonds pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 475 for the purpose of carrying out the powers granted by this section.

### CHAPTER 118—H. F. No. 68

An act relating to aids received from the federal government, amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 128.111.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 128.111, is amended to read:

128.111. Federal moneys not chargeable against gross earnings aid. The moneys received from the federal government by any school district as its share of the distribution of proceeds from the sale of timber or rental of lands shall not be chargeable against the gross earnings aid received by the district under the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 1953, section 128.22 as amended by Laws 1955, Chapter 689.

An act relating to containers used in delivering dairy products; amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 32.26.
