seeking appropriate temporary relief against the respondent, pending final determination of proceedings under this chapter, including an order or decree restraining him from doing or procuring any an act tending to render ineffectual any an order the commissioner may enter with respect to the complaint. The court shall have power to grant such temporary relief or a restraining order as it deems just and proper, but no such relief or order extending beyond ten days shall be granted except by consent of the respondent or after hearing upon notice to the respondent and a finding by the court that there is reasonable cause to believe that the respondent has engaged in a discriminatory practice. The Minnesota rules of civil procedure shall apply to such an application, and the district court shall have authority to grant or deny such relief sought on such conditions as it deems just and equitable. All hearings under this section shall be given precedence as nearly as practicable over all other pending civil actions.

(4) If any <u>a</u> lessor, after he has engaged in a discriminatory practice defined in section 363.03, subdivision 2, clause (1), (a), shall lease or rent such <u>a</u> dwelling unit to a person who has no knowledge of such the practice or of the existence of any <u>a</u> charge with respect thereto to the practice, such the lessor shall be liable for actual damages sustained by such <u>a</u> person by reason of any <u>a</u> final order hereunder <u>as provided in this section</u> requiring such the person to be evicted from such the dwelling unit.

Sec. 2. This act is effective the day following its final enactment.

CHAPTER 157-H.F.No.606

An act relating to controlled substances; amending the definition of Cannabis; amending certain schedules; adding the precursors of phencyclidine; amending Minnesota Statutes 1978, Sections 152.01, Subdivision 9; and 152.02, Subdivisions 2, 3 and 4.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1978, Section 152.01, Subdivision 9, is amended to read:

. Subd. 9. MARIJUANA. "Marijuana" means all parts of the plant of any species of the genus Cannabis sative L., including all agronomical varieties, whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of such plant; and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of such plant, its seeds or resin, but shall not include the mature stalks of such plant, fiber from such stalks, oil or cake made from the seeds of such plant, any other compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of such stalks, oil, or cake, or the sterilized seed of such plant which is incapable of germination.

Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 1978, Section 152.02, Subdivision 2, is amended to read:

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Subd. 2. The following items are listed in Schedule I:

Any person who manufactures peyote for or distributes peyote to the Native American Church, however, is required to obtain federal registration annually and to comply with all other requirements of law.

(5) Unless specifically excepted or unless listed in another schedule, any material compound, mixture, or preparation which contains any quantity of the following substances having a depressant effect on the central nervous system, including its salts, isomers, and salts of isomers whenever the existence of such salts, isomers, and salts of isomers is possible within the specific chemical designation:

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Mecloqualone.

Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 1978, Section 152.02, Subdivision 3, is amended to read:

Subd. 3. The following items are listed in Schedule II:

(1) Unless specifically excepted or unless listed in another schedule, any of the following substances whether produced directly or indirectly by extraction from substances of vegetable origin or independently by means of chemical synthesis, or by a combination of extraction and chemical synthesis:

(a) Opium and opiate, and any salt, compound, derivative, or preparation of opium or opiate, including the following: raw opium, opium extracts, opium fluidextracts, powdered opium, granulated opium, tincture of opium, apomorphine, codeine, ethylmorphine, hydrocodone, hydromorphone, metopon, morphine, oxycodone, oxymorphone, thebaine.

(b) Any salt, compound, derivative, or preparation thereof which is chemically equivalent or identical with any of the substances referred to in clause (a), except that these substances shall not include the isoquinoline alkaloids of opium.

(c) Opium poppy and poppy straw.

(d) Coca leaves and any salt, compound, derivative, or preparation of coca leaves, and any salt, compound, derivative, or preparation thereof which is chemically equivalent or identical with any of these substances, except that the substances shall not include decocainized coca leaves or extraction of coca leaves, which extractions do not contain cocaine or ecgonine.

(a) Methaqualone

(b) Amobarbital

(c) Secobarbital

(d) Pentobarbital

(e) Phencyclidine

(f) Phencyclidine immediate precursors:

(i) <u>1-phenylcyclohexylamine</u>

(ii) 1-piperidinocyclohexanecarbonitrile.

Sec. 4. Minnesota Statutes 1978, Section 152.02, Subdivision 4, is amended to read:

Subd. 4. The following items are listed in Schedule III:

(1) Any material, compound, mixture, or preparation which contains any quantity of Amphetamine, its salts, optical isomers, and salts of its optical isomers; Phenmetrazine and its salts; Methamphetamine, its salts, isomers, and salts of isomers; Methpyphenidate Methylphenidate; and which is required by federal law to be labeled with the symbol prescribed by 21 Code of Federal Regulations Section 1302.03 and in effect on February 1, 1976 designating that the drug is listed as a Schedule III controlled substance under federal law.

(2) Any material, compound, mixture, or preparation which contains any quantity of the following substances having a potential for abuse associated with a depressant effect on the central nervous system:

(a) Any compound, mixture, or preparation containing amobarbital, secobarbital, pentobarbital or any salt thereof and one or more other active medicinal ingredients which are not listed in any schedule.

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. (b) Any suppository dosage form containing amobarbital, secobarbital, pentobarbital, or any salt of any of these drugs and approved by the food and drug administration for marketing only as a suppository.

(c) Any substance which contains any quantity of a derivative of barbituric acid, or any salt of a derivative of barbituric acid, except those substances which are specifically listed in other schedules: Chlorhexadol: Glutethimide; Lysergic acid; Lysergic acid amide; Methyprylon; Pheneyelidine; Sulfondiethylmethane; Sulfonethylmethane; Sulfonmethane.

(3) Any material, compound, mixture, or preparation which contains any quantity of the following substances having a potential for abuse associated with a stimulant effect on the central nervous system:

(a) Benzphetamine

(b) Chlorphentermine

(c) Clortermine

(d) Mazindol

(e) Phendimetrazine.

(4) Nalorphine.

(5) Any material, compound, mixture, or preparation containing limited quantities of any of the following narcotic drugs, or any salts thereof:

(a) Not more than 1.80 grams of codeine per 100 milliliters or not more than 90 milligrams per dosage unit, with an equal or greater quantity of an isoquinoline alkaloid of opium.

(b) Not more than 1.80 grams of codeine per 100 milliliters or not more than 90 milligrams per dosage unit, with one or more active, non-narcotic ingredients in recognized therapeutic amounts.

(c) Not more than 300 milligrams of dihydrocodeinone per 100 milliliters or not more than 15 milligrams per dosage unit, with a fourfold or greater quantity of an isoquinoline alkaloid of opium.

(d) Not more than 300 milligrams of dihydrocodeinone per 100 milliliters or not more than 15 milligrams per dosage unit, with one or more active, non-narcotic ingredients in recognized therapeutic amounts.

(e) Not more than 1.80 grams of dihydrocodeine per 100 milliliters or not more than 90 milligrams per dosage unit, with one or more active, non-narcotic ingredients in recognized therapeutic amounts.

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(f) Not more than 300 milligrams of ethylmorphine per 100 milliliters or not more than 15 milligrams per dosage unit, with one or more active, non-narcotic ingredients in recognized therapeutic amounts.

(g) Not more than 500 milligrams of opium per 100 milliliters or per 100 grams, or not more than 25 milligrams per dosage unit, with one or more active, non-narcotic ingredients in recognized therapeutic amounts.

(h) Not more than 50 milligrams of morphine per 100 milliliters or per 100 grams with one or more active, non-narcotic ingredients in recognized therapeutic amounts.

CHAPTER 158-H.F.No.623

An act relating to state lands; providing for the conveyance of state land to the city of St. Cloud for use as a fire station.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. The governor, upon the recommendation of the commissioner of administration and in exchange for the mutual benefits inuring to the state of Minnesota and the city of St. Cloud by the location of a fire station in close proximity to the St. Cloud Reformatory, may convey by quitclaim deed, in the form the attorney general approves, in the name of the state of Minnesota, the following described property:

That part of the northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of section 7, township 35, range 30, Sherburne County, Minnesota described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the west line of said northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of section 7 distant 368.40 feet south of (assumed bearing of due south) the northwest corner thereof; thence south 81 degrees, 19 minutes and 36 seconds east for 712.57 feet; thence south 8 degrees, 27 minutes and 42 seconds for 355.78 feet to the centerline of Minnesota Boulevard; thence north 82 degrees, 52 minutes and 24 seconds west, along said centerline, for 657.15 feet, to said west line; thence north, along said west line for 377.84 feet to the point of beginning, containing 5.74 acres more or less subject to easements of record and excepting therefrom the right of way of Trunk Highway No. 301 as now located and established.

Sec. 2. The land shall be conveyed to the city of St. Cloud for use as a fire station and for related activities. If the property is no longer used or needed for that specific purpose, the title shall revert to the state of Minnesota.

Sec. 3. This act is effective the day following its final enactment.
