Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 303.17, Subdivision 1, is amended to read:

303.17 License, revocation. Subdivision 1. Grounds. The certificate of authority of a foreign corporation to transact business in this state shall be revoked by the secretary of state if it fails:

(1) To pay any fee due under the provisions of this chapter;

(2) To designate a registered agent when a vacancy occurs in that office, or when the appointed registered agent becomes disqualified or incapacitated;

(3) To file amendments to its articles of incorporation, articles of reduction of stated capital, or articles of merger or consolidation, as required in section 303.11;

(4) To file an annual report; or

(5) To comply with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 303.04, and acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, in so far as it relates to the limits of territory in which a savings and loan, building and loan, or savings, building and loan association organized under the laws of another state may carry on the business of making real estate mortgages.

## CHAPTER 221-S. F. No. 400 [Coded as Section 35.72]

An act to require operators of creameries, milk or cream

collecting stations or any establishment where milk or cream is purchased or assembled for processing or sale to submit samples of such milk or cream to agents of the State Live Stock Sanitary Board for testing to determine if the cattle producing such milk or cream are affected with disease.

## Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota: [35.72] Section 1. Milk or cream; testing by Livestock

Sanitary Board. [Subdivision 1.] Establishment defined. As used in this act establishment means any creamery, milk or cream collecting station or any place of business where milk or cream is purchased or assembled for processing or sale.

Sec. 2. [Subd. 2.] **Right of entry on premises.** The state livestock sanitary board or its authorized agents shall have the right to enter the premises of any establishment or buildings located thereon for the purpose of collecting samples of milk or cream delivered to such establishment.

Sec. 3. [Subd. 3.] Samples, procurement. Upon demand of the state live stock sanitary board or its authorized agents, the operator of any establishment shall submit any or all containers of milk or cream delivered to such establishment to the agents of said board before any milk or cream is removed therefrom, or any substance or thing added thereto, and shall allow such agent to procure a sample of such milk or cream from each container, such sample not to exceed one ounce in weight, for the purpose of applying any recognized test to determine the existence of disease in the cattle which produced such milk or cream.

Sec. 4. [Subd. 4.] Names and addresses furnished. The operator of the establishment shall furnish the agents of the live stock sanitary board, the name and address of the person delivering each container of milk or cream to the establishment, and the name and address of the owner or caretaker of the cattle which produced such milk and cream.

Sec. 5. [Subd. 5.] Contamination, duty to prevent. The agent of the board shall use due diligence to prevent contamination of the milk or cream while procuring said samples, and to delay as little as possible, the normal operation of the establishment.

Sec. 6. [Subd. 6.] Violation, Penalty. Any person violating any provision of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.
