access to the site for construction, maintenance and for fish management purposes and to have the right to use any earth and other materials on said premises to construct and maintain a roadway is so indefinite as to effect the marketability of the entire 30 acre tract.

Sec. 3. The commissioner of natural resources, by quitclaim deed, in such form as the attorney general approves, in the name of the state, and for the consideration of \$1, shall convey to Donald Bartz and wife Bonita, Orville Jaekel and wife Anna Marie, Dale Thiesfeld and wife Gloria, and Wilford Stender all of its rights to that portion of the easement "Employees and agents of the state shall have access to the site for construction, maintenance and for fish management purposes, and shall have the right to use any earth and other materials on said premises to construct and maintain a roadway" upon receipt of a properly executed easement to the state of Minnesota, department of natural resources granting the following easement:

"Employees and agents of the state shall have access to the site for construction, maintenance and for fish management purposes over and across that portion of the West 30 acres of the South Half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 27, Township 116 North, Range 26 West, in the county of Carver, State of Minnesota, lying 70 feet on each side of the centerline of the existing channel flowing in and through said premises."

CHAPTER 280—S.F.No.2480

An act relating to the establishment of Moose Lake state recreation area.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. [85.013] Subd. 18a MOOSE LAKE STATE RECRE-ATION AREA, CARLTON COUNTY. Moose Lake state recreation area is established in Carlton county.

Sec. 2. The commissioner of administration is authorized to transfer custodial control of surplus state institution lands, formerly administered by the Moose Lake state hospital, to the commissioner

of natural resources, which lands to be transferred are described as follows:

Government Lot 5 and the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$) in Section 21; the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$) in Section 22; the west one-half of the northeast quarter (W $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$), the northwest quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$); the north one-half of the southwest quarter (N $\frac{1}{2}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$) Government Lots 1 and 2 and the west one-half of the southeast quarter (W $\frac{1}{2}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$) all in Section 27; the northeast quarter, that part of Government Lot 2 lying north of the north $\frac{1}{16}$ line, the north one-half of the southeast one quarter (N $\frac{1}{2}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$), Government Lot 3, and the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ all in Section 28. Government Lot 2 and the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$) in Section 33 and Government Lot 1 of Section 34, all in Township 46 north, Range 19 west, Carlton county, Minnesota, and excepting from such described lands the right-of-way of interstate highway No.35.

The lands so transferred shall be administered in the same manner as provided for other state recreation areas and shall be perpetually dedicated for such use.

356.20 RETIREMENT SYSTEMS; FINANCIAL REPORTS AND ACTUARIAL SURVEYS. Subdivision 1. The governing or managing board or administrative officials of the public pension and retirement funds enumerated in subdivision 2 shall annually prepare and file a financial report following the close of each fiscal year.
