beginning at the intersection of University Avenue SE and 6th Avenue SE; thence northwesterly to the intersection of University Avenue NE and 8th Avenue NE; thence southwesterly along said avenue across the Plymouth Avenue Bridge to the intersection of Plymouth Avenue and 2nd Street N; thence southeasterly along said street to the intersection of 2nd Street S and 10th Avenue S; thence northeasterly along said avenue to its end and following an imaginary line across the Mississippi River to the beginning of 6th Avenue SE; thence northeasterly along said avenue to the point of beginning beginning at the intersection of Second Street North and the south right-of-way line of proposed Interstate Highway 335 (State Project 2788-01) as identified on February 1, 1972; following Second Street southeasterly to its intersection with Tenth Avenue South; thence northeasterly along Tenth Avenue south and along an imaginary line which is an extension thereof to the beginning of Sixth Avenue Southeast on the east bank of the Mississippi River and along Sixth Avenue Southeast to its intersection with University Avenue; thence northwesterly along University Avenue to the south right-of-way line of proposed Interstate Highway 335 (State Project 2788-01) as identified on February 1, 1972, and thence northwesterly along the proposed Interstate 335 right-of-way to the point of beginning.
