An act relating to highways; directing the department of transportation to utilize a certain corridor in Washington county for the construction of interstate highway marked No. 1 94.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. [161.124] INTERSTATE I 94, USE OF TRUNK HIGHWAY 12. The department of transportation shall utilize the existing trunk highway marked No. 12 corridor between the intersection of interstate highways marked I 94 and I 694-494 to the St. Croix river in central Washington county for the construction of interstate highway marked 1 94, acquiring only that additional right of way required to comply with current federal design standards.

CHAPTER 570-H.F.No.1966

An act relating to motor vehicles; extending protection provided by motor vehicle dealer surety bonds; authorizing the issuance of nontransferable certificates of title; changing the definition of a bus; amending Minnesota Statutes 1976, Sections 168A.07, Subdivision 2; 171.01, Subdivision 19; Minnesota Statutes, 1977 Supplement, Section 168.27, Subdivision 24.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes, 1977 Supplement, Section 168.27, Subdivision 24, is amended to read:

Subd. 24. BONDS. All persons licensed hereunder shall keep in full force and effect a bond with a corporate surety to be approved by the registrar of motor vehicles in amounts as herein provided; in the case of boat or snowmobile trailer dealers in the amount of \$1,000; in the case of motorcycle dealers in the amount of \$2,500; and as to all other persons in the amount of \$10,000. The bond shall be conditioned on the faithful performance by the licensee of the obligations imposed by the <u>law laws of this state</u>, including the conduct required of a licensee by this section, and the payment of all taxes, license fees and penalties. Said bond shall be for the benefit of the state of Minnesota and any <u>transferor</u>, seller, or purchaser of a motor vehicle for any monetary loss caused by failure of the licensee to meet the obligations enumerated above. Proceedings on the forfeiture of the bonds shall be commenced in the district court of the county wherein the business of the licensee person was carried on, or if in more than one county, the county in which the offense occurred.

LAWS of MINNESOTA for 1978

Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 1976, Section 168A.07, Subdivision 2, is amended to read:

Subd. 2. In the event the issuance of a certificate of title is withheld in accordance with subdivision 1, or because the applicant is unable to surrender an existing certificate of title to the vehicle issued by another state, the department, upon payment of the same fee as for issuing a certificate of title, shall may issue to the applicant a nontransferable certificate in form designated by the department certifying that the applicant has applied for a certificate of title; provided that such certificate shall not be issued if the department has reasonable grounds to believe the applicant is not the owner or that the application contains a false or fraudulent statement.

Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 1976, Section 171.01, Subdivision 19, is amended to read:

Subd. 19. "Bus" means every motor vehicle designed for carrying more than ten passengers and used for the transportation of persons, and every motor vehicle other than a taxicab designed and used for the transportation of persons for compensation.

The term does not include a vehicle designed for carrying more than ten passengers but not more than 14 passengers and operated for the personal or family use of the owner or operator.

Sec. 4. This act is effective on the day following final enactment.

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1976, Section 62F.01, is amended to read:

62F.01 CITATION; EXPIRATION DATE. <u>Subdivision 1.</u> Sections 62F.01 to 62F.14 may be cited as the "Temporary Joint Underwriting Association Act."

Subd. 2. Sections 62F.01 to 62F.14 expire September 1, 1980.

Sec. 2. REPEALER. Laws 1976, Chapter 242, Section 16, is repealed.

Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act is effective the day following its final enactment.
