any city of the second and third class in this state is hereby authorized to levy a tax annually of not to exceed one mill against the taxable property in any such city for the purpose of advertising agricultural, industrial business, and all other general resources of the community, provided however, that such levy is made within the mill levy or per capita limitation fixed by law for such city.
