not begin to run until a patent has been issued for the land so damaged;

(4) Against a master for breach of an indenture of apprenticeship; the limitation, in such case, to run from the expiration of the term of service;

(5) For the recovery of wages or overtime or damages, fees or penalties accruing under any federal or state law respecting the payment of wages or overtime or damages, fees or penalties, (the term "wages" as used herein shall mean all remuneration for services or employment, including commissions and bonuses and the cash value of all remuneration in any medium other than cash, where the relationship of master and servant exists and the term "damages", as used herein, shall mean single, double or treble damages, accorded by any statutory cause of action whatsoever and whether or not the relationship of master and servant exists).

(6) For damages caused by the establishment of a street or highway grade or a change in the originally established grade.

Sec. 2. [541.071] Special limitation. An action to recover damages heretofore caused by the establishment of a street or highway grade or a change in the originally establihed grade may be brought within the time prescribed in Section 1 or within six months after the passage of this act, whichever is the longer period.

## CHAPTER 844-S. F. No. 1108

An act relating to abandoned or neglecting cemeteries; amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 306.243, Subdivision 3.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 306.243, Subdivision 3, is amended to read:

Subd. 3. May delegate duties. The management and supervision of the maintenance and care of the abandoned cemeteries, and abandoned or neglected private cemeteries, or the removal of bodies as herein provided shall be delegated by the county board to the county highway department or to some existing cemetery association, veterans organization or Boy

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Scouts of America Area Council, or other charitable institution which shall be responsible to the county board for its acts.

## CHAPTER 845-S. F. No. 1254

An act relating to highway traffic regulation; amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 169.91.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 169.91, is amended to read:

169.91 Arrests. Subdivision 1. Procedure. When any person is arrested for any violation of this chapter punishable as a misdemeanor, gross misdemeanor, or felony, the arrested person shall be taken into custody and immediately taken before a magistrate within the county in which the offense charged is alleged to have been committed and who has jurisdiction of such offenses and is nearest or most accessible with reference to the place where the arrest is made, in any of the following cases:

(1) When a person arrested demands an immediate appearance before a magistrate;

(2) When a person is arrested and charged with an offense under this chapter causing or contributing to an accident resulting in injury or death to any person;

(3) When the person is arrested upon a charge of negligent homicide;

(4) When the person is arrested upon a charge of driving or operating or being in actual physical control of any motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs;

(5) When the person is arrested upon a charge of failure to stop in the event of an accident causing death, personal injuries, or damage to property;

(6) When there is reasonable cause for believing that the person arrested may leave the state;

(7) In any other event when the person arrested refused to give his written promise to appear in court, as hereinafter provided.
