Subd. 3. [85.111] Crow Wing State Park. For the establishment of a new state park in Crow Wing County, the Commissioner of Conservation may acquire by gift, purchase or condemnation the following described lands;

Government lots 2, 3 and 4 and the southwest quarter of the southeast quarter of section 13; Government lots 1, 2, 3 and 4 of section 23; Government lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 and the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of section 24; the northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of section 25; Government lots 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter, and the west half of the southeast quarter of section 26; all in township 44 north, range 32 west, Crow Wing County;

Government lot 1 of section 34, township 133 north, range 29 west, Crow Wing County;

Island No. 1 and Government lots 2 and 3 of section 4; Government lot 4 and all that part of the southwest quarter of the southeast quarter and the northeast quarter of the southeast quarter lying southeasterly of a straight line running from the south quarter corner to the east quarter corner of section 5; Government lots 1 and 2, the southeast quarter of the northwest quarter, and all that part of the southwest quarter of the northwest quarter and the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter lying southeasterly of a straight line running from the west quarter corner to the north quarter corner of section 8; all in township 132 north, range 29 west, Morrison County;

All that part of section 4, township 132 north, range 29 west, Cass County, bounded by the Mississippi River and the south line of Government lots 11 and 12 of section 33, township 132 north, range 29 west;

All that part of Government lot 1 of section 4, township 132 north, range 29 west, Cass County, and all that part of Government lots 9 and 10 of section 33, township 133 north, range 29 west, Cass County, lying southeasterly of a line described as follows: beginning at a point at the north shore of the Crow Wing River where a line 700 feet east from and parallel to the west line of Government lot 1 of section 4, township 132 north, range 29 west, would intersect said shore, thence in a straight line to the center of section 33, township 133 north, range 29 west;

Government lots 8, 11 and 12 and the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter of section 33, and all that part of Government lots 1, 6 and 7 of section 33 lying southeasterly of a straight line running from the center of said section 33 to the northwest corner of said section 33, all in township 133 north, range 29 west.

All of the lands described in Subd. 3 when acquired as herein provided, shall be perpetually dedicated for state park purposes and administered in the manner provided for other state parks, and shall be known as the Crow Wing State Park.

There is hereby appropriated to the Commissioner of Conservation the sum of \$15,000 for the purposes of this act, which shall remain available until expended, provided that no part of said sum shall be expended until there has been made available to the commissioner, for the purposes of this act, gifts of cash or land of the value of \$15,000 as determined by the commissioner.

- Sec. 6. [137.021] Building construction and equipment grants. The Regents of the University of Minnesota are hereby designated the state agency empowered to accept any and all moneys provided for or made available to this state by the United States of America or any department or agency thereof for the construction and equipping of any building for University or college purposes in accordance with the provisions of federal law and any rules or regulations promulgated thereunder and are further authorized to do any and all things required of this state by such federal law and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder in order to obtain such federal moneys.
- Sec. 7. Lands or sites for public buildings, the acquisition of which is included in the appropriations made by this act may be acquired by gift, purchase or condemnation proceedings by the Regents of the University in case of lands for the University and by the Commissioner of Administration in the case of other lands. If any of such lands are acquired by condemnation proceedings, such proceeding shall be undertaken pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 1957, Chapter 117, and acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto.
- Sec. 8. Subdivision 1. Upon the awarding of final contracts for the completion of any projects enumerated in Section 2, subdivisions 2 to 28, the Commissioner of Administration may transfer any unexpended funds in said project account to any other project therein enumerated.
- Subd. 2. Upon the awarding of final contracts for the completion of any projects enumerated in Section 2, subdivisions 29 to 33, the Commissioner of Administration may transfer any unexpended funds in said project account to any other project therein enumerated.
- Subd. 3. Upon the awarding of final contracts for the completion of any projects enumerated in Section 2, subdivision 34, the Commissioner of Administration may transfer any unexpended funds in said project account to any other project therein enumerated.
- Subd. 4. The Commissioner of Administration shall report to the Legislative Building Commission on transfers of funds made under this section.
- Sec. 9. Subdivision 1. Upon the awarding of final contracts for the completion of any projects enumerated in Section 4, the Commissioner of Conservation may transfer any unexpended funds in said project account to any other project therein enumerated.

- Subd. 2. The Commissioner of Conservation shall report to the Legislative Building Commission on transfers of funds made under this section.
- Sec. 10. Subdivision 1. Upon the awarding of final contracts for the completion of any projects enumerated in Section 5, subdivisions 2 to 12, the Regents of the University of Minnesota may transfer any unexpended funds in said project account to any other project therein enumerated.
- Subd. 2. The Regents of the University of Minnesota shall report to the Legislative Building Commission on transfers made under this section.
- Sec. 11. Such sums of money as may be necessary to make the transfers provided for in Sections 8 through 10 are hereby appropriated for such purposes.
- Sec. 12. There is hereby appropriated to the Commissioner of Administration, not to exceed \$100,000 which may be expended by him for the administration of the building program covered by his appropriation, including the employment of personnel. Any persons so employed shall be in the unclassified service.
- Sec. 13. The moneys appropriated to the Commissioner of Administration for contingencies in the sum of \$200,000 by Section 3, subdivision 5, may be expended for the maintenance, repair, construction, reconstruction, improvement or rehabilitation of any state-owned building or structure if it appears to the Commissioner that such an expenditure is necessary in the public interest in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property and funds have not been otherwise appropriated for such purposes. The Commissioner, however, shall not authorize any expenditure from such appropriation until he has first consulted the Legislative Building Commission and such Commission has made its recommendations thereon. Such recommendation shall be advisory only. Failure or refusal of the Commission to make a recommendation promptly shall be deemed a negative recommendation.
- Sec. 14. Subdivision 1. For the purpose of providing funds appropriated by this act, there is hereby levied upon all the taxable property in this state, including, notwithstanding the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 1957, section 273.13, subdivisions 6 and 7, as amended, all real property used for the purposes of a homestead, a tax sufficient to produce \$52,022,280 which the state auditor shall cause to be extended and collected in the manner in which other state taxes upon real and personal property are extended and collected, to be included in the

levies spread upon the tax rolls for the years 1959-1978, inclusive, in amounts sufficient to produce the sum of \$2,601,000 in each of the years 1960 to 1979, inclusive, plus additional amounts sufficient to produce such sums as may be necessary to pay the interest upon certificates of indebtedness issued pursuant to the provisions of this act. The proceeds of such tax levies and of the sale of certificates of indebtedness issued hereunder shall be credited to the Minnesota state building fund. In case of a deficiency of such tax levy for any year, the auditor shall levy sufficient additional amounts in succeeding years to compensate therefor until the full amount herein authorized has been raised. The moneys in the Minnesota state building fund are hereby appropriated for the purposes herein specified.

Subd. 2. The state auditor shall, in anticipation of the collection of taxes levied in subdivision 1 hereof, issue and sell certificates of indebtedness in the amount and subject to the limitations herein prescribed. Such certificates shall be known as state building certificates of 1959–1978, and shall be issued upon the certification of the Commissioner of Administration that funds are needed for the purposes authorized herein, not exceeding \$52,022,280 in the aggregate. Such certificates shall be numbered consecutively and shall be issued and sold at not less than par upon sealed bids after two week's published notice, unless sold to the state board of investment, which may invest any funds under its control or direction in any such certificates of indebtedness so issued and to purchase such certificates, notwithstanding any limitations imposed by Minnesota Statutes 1957, section 11.10 or any other law inconsistent herewith, at such rate of interest as it may determine. Such certificates and the interest coupons attached thereto when issued shall have all the qualities of negotiable instruments and shall be incontestable in the hands of a bona fide holder thereof of value notwithstanding any provisions in Minnesota Statutes 1957, chapter 335, to the contrary. Such certificates shall be in such sum and of such denomination and shall mature at such times as the state auditor shall determine, not exceeding the time when funds shall be available for the payment thereof from the tax levies herein authorized. Such certificates shall bear such rate of interest, payable semi-annually, and shall contain such other terms and provisions not inconsistent herewith, as the state auditor may require. Such certificates shall be signed by the state treasurer and attested by the state auditor under their official seals and the state auditor and the state treasurer shall keep records thereof. Such certificates shall be a charge against the taxes herein authorized. The principal and interest of such certificates shall be payable from the proceeds of such taxes, and so much thereof as may

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be necessary is hereby appropriated for such payments, provided that such interest as may become due at any time when there is not on hand a sufficient amount from the proceeds of such taxes to pay the same, shall be paid out of the general revenue fund in the state treasury, and the amount necessary therefor is hereby appropriated, to be reimbursed from the proceeds of such taxes when received.

- Subd. 3. Any expenses incidental to the printing and sale of certificates of indebtedness, including actual and necessary travel and subsistence expenses of state officers and employees for such purposes, shall be paid from the Minnesota state building fund and the amounts therefor are hereby appropriated from such funds.
- Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, all the moneys appropriated herein shall be deemed for construction or other permanent improvement and shall be available until the purposes for which such appropriation was made shall have been accomplished or abandoned.
- Sec. 16. All tax levies authorized under authority of Minnesota Statutes 1957, Section 195.09 are hereby repealed.
