

[No. 4.]—Joint Resolution relative to the number of copies of the Laws and Journals to be printed. November 1, 1848.

*Resolved*, That there be printed by the persons authorized to print the laws and journals, one thousand copies of the laws passed at the present session of the Legislative Assembly and five hundred copies of the journals of each house, and that fifty copies of the laws and ten copies each of the journals of both houses be distributed by the Secretary of the Territory to the Register of Deeds of each county and that the balance remain in the public Library, each member of the Legislative Assembly shall be entitled to one copy of the laws and two copies of the journals when printed also each officer of the present Assembly.

Laws, 1000 copies printed, and 500 of the Journals, and distributed, etc.

[No. 5.]—Joint Resolution relative to a donation to the Washington Monument Association. October 11, 1849.

*Whereas*, A communication has been received by the Council from the Hon. H. H. Sibley conveying the information that a block of the E-an-shah, or Red Stone has been by him procured for the purpose of having it placed in the Washington Monument, now in progress of erection at the City of Washington and tendering the same to the Legislative Assembly to be appropriated for that purpose.

*Be it therefore resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota*, That the said block of stone be received, to be appropriated for the above named object, and that the thanks of the citizens of this Territory are due and are hereby tendered the Hon. H. H. Sibley for the liberality and patriotism which he has manifested in procuring the same.

A block of the red stone appropriated to the Washington Monument.

*Resolved*, That his Excellency the Governor be requested to receive the above block presented by the Hon. H. H. Sibley and procure its transportation to the City of Washington and present it or cause it to be presented to the Washington Monument Association as an offering of Minnesota to the memory of the father of his country, accompanied by a request that the appropriate inscriptions may be placed upon it, and that it may receive its proper position in said monument.

The Governor to have the stone transported to Washington City for the Washington Monument Association.

APPROVED the eleventh day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine.

[No. 6.]—Resolution relative to Council Districts. November 1, 1848.

*Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota*: That the several Council Districts as established by proclamation of the Governor July the 7th, 1849 are continued in force as well as the manner of opening conducting and closing said elections, making the returns thereof, as provided for in said proclamation.

Certain Council Districts continued in force.
