[NO. III.]—MEMORIAL to Congress relative to a further appropriation for the Public Buildings in the Territory of Minnesota.

To the Honorable, the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States, in Congress assembled:

Preamble, &c.

The Memorial of the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota, respectfully sheweth: That the appropriation of forty thousand dollars made by Congress in the year eighteen hundred and fifty, for the erection of a State House at St. Paul, and for a Territorial Prison at Stillwater in said Territory, has been nearly expended, and but a very small amount remains in the Treasury; that the said Capitol and Prison Buildings have been examined by a Joint Committee of the Legislative Assembly, and they found by observation, by examination of the contract, and by the report of the Building Commissioners, that the same are but a little more than half completed, and the work thereon suspended for want of sufficient funds to carry on the same: Therefore, we respectfully and urgently urge upon your honorable body the necessity of a further appropriation for the completion of the said buildings, in order that they may be of that use to the Government and Territory for which they were designed.
