## CHAPTER 14.

An Act to amend on Act entitled "an Act to Incorporate the Rum River Brom Company.

March 4, 1854.

ECTION.

1. Amendment. How company to turn
2. Amendment. When charges are the duc. SECTION. out logs, &c.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Amendment. Minnesota, That the twelfth section of the act entitled an act to incorporate the "Rum River Boom Company," shall be amended as

to read as follows, viz:

The said company shall turn out of said boom, said logs and timber in the same order in which they came in, the number of logs to be turned out each day, to be determined by the request of a majority in value of the log owners, which request shall be in writing, and shall be made one day previous to the day of turning out said logs; and after all said logs and timber shall have been turned out of said boom as above provided, the said company shall drive the same into the Mississippi river: Provided, That nothing contained in this section shall be so construed as to compel the said company to drive any logs or timber, as aforesaid, in case the said company shall have followed the request above mentioned, and shall be prevented from driving the said logs and timber by want of sufficient water for driving the same.

SEC. 2. The fourteenth section of the said act, entitled an act to incorporate the Rum River Boom Company, shall be so amended

as to read as follows, viz:

The boom charges aforesaid, shall be deemed due, and shall be paid to the said company, when the said logs or timber are turned out as aforesaid; Provided, That if said boomage be not so paid, the said company may, and are hereby authorised, to retain in their possession, in Rum river, a sufficient number of logs of each and every mark, to cover the amount due to said company for boomage, for each and every mark, computing said logs at the highest market price at said Rum River Boom; and said logs so retained, shall be immediately scaled and marked with the mark of said company, and shall become the property of said company.
