CHAPTER 42.

March 4, 1854.

An Act relative to Sheep and Swine.

SECTION

1. Sheep and Swine—when to run at large.

SECTION

2. Where in force.
3. Eligibility to office.

Sheep and Swine—when to run at large.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota: That it shall and may be lawful for Sheep and Swine, to run at large, in and upon the open commons, on unoccupied grounds in this Territory, at any, and all times, between the first day of May, and the first day of November, in each and every year. *Provided,* that a majority of the legal voters shall so determine at any regular meeting of said precinct.

Where in force.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, that this Act shall not extend to, or have force within the precincts of any Incorporated Town or City.

Eligibility to office.

SEC. 3. That no person shall be eligible to hold any office under the Laws of this Territory, who has not been a resident of this Territory for six months preceding his election or appointment.
