counties, before any court having competent jurisdiction, and shall be further liable in a like action, for all damages any person shall sustain by reason of the neglect of Richard G Murphy to fulfil any of the duties imposed upon him in this act. And any person who shall sustain any injury by the negligence or default of the said Murphy, or the ferrymen in his employ, may have a remedy by an action upon the bond required in this act.

Sec. 6. The Legislature may repeal, alter or amend this act at any time.

## CHAPTER CXXII.

An Act to authorize the Regents of the Minnesota University to borrow money.

Section 1. Board of Regents empowered to issue bonds,

2. Regents empowered to mortgage lands.

3. Authorized to negotiate bonds.

4. Sums received to be used to pay expenses.

5. When to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota.

SECTION 1. That the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota, are hereby empowered to issue bonds in the name of the said University, of Minnesota, and under the corporate seal of said University signed by the President and attested by the Secretary of the said Board of Regents, and payable at such times, and in such manner, as the said Board may deem best, to an amount not exceeding the sum of fifteen thousand dollars with interest thereon at a rate not exceeding twelve per cent per annum of said sum, five thousand dollars to be applied in liquidation of a debt incurred in the purchase of a site for said University, and ten thousand dollars to be expended under the direction of the Board of Regents in erecting suitable buildings for the same.

SEC. 2. And the said Regents are hereby further empowered, in or mortgage lands der to secure the payment of said bonds, to make, execute and deliver in the name of the Territory of Minnesota, a mortgage or mortgages on any lands now belonging, or which may hereafter belong to the said Uni-

lesue bonds

versity, and said mortgage or mortgages signed by the President of the Board of Regents, and duly acknowledged by the said President before any person authorized to take acknowledgments of deeds in this Territory, and recorded in the office of Register of deeds of the county in which said lands so mortgaged are situated, or in the county to which it is attached for judicial purposes, shall be a lien upon the said lands, until all sums owing upon said bonds are fully discharged.

Negotiale bonds

SEC. 3. And the said Regents are further empowered to authorize by majority vote of the whole board any one or more of their number to negotiate the said bonds on such time and terms, and in such places as they may deem best to subserve the purposes contemplated by this act, and receive the money therefor.

Sums received to be used for building Sec. 4. Any or all sums received from the sale of the bonds aforesaid shall be used for no other purpose than to pay the expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of this act, and for constructing a suitable building or buildings to be used for educational purposes solely, under the requirements of chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of the Territory of Minnesota.

Take effect

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

An Act granting to S. B. Lowry the right to establish and maintain a Ferry across the Mississippi River, at St. Cloud.

SECTION 1. Ferry granted to S. B. Lowry.

2. Keep good boat.

3. Rates of ferriage.

4. File bond.

5. Penalty for neglect.

6. Give bond to County Commissioner.

7. When to take effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota:

Section 1. That S. B. Lowry, his heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns, shall have the privilege and right for the period of fifteen years, of keeping and maintaining a ferry across the Mississippi River, at or near Ferry Street, in the town of St. Cloud, and no other ferry shall be established within one half mile of said ferry, either above or below the same.
