*An Act to make certain Appropriations for the Current Expenses of the State.*

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That the sum of forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) or as much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated to be applied to the payment of members and officers of the present Legislature. Members of Legislature

SEC. 2. That the sum of fifty-five thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated for the payment of the members, officers, and incidental expenses of both branches of the Constitutional Convention held in St. Paul in July and August, 1857. Constitutional Convention

SEC. 3. That the sum of four thousand, eight hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the payment of the principal and interest of bonds issued by Act of the Territorial Legislature approved May 23d, 1857, and falling due on or about May 23, 1858, to be paid to the holders of said bonds or their legal representatives on the said day of maturity. Interest on territorial bonds

SEC. 4. That the sum of one thousand seven hundred and sixty-five dollars and eleven cents (\$1765 11) be and the same is hereby appropriated to Goodrich, Somers & Co. assignees of Earle S. Goodrich, for preparing sectional headings, side-notes, and index, and for copying and printing the Laws of the Extra Session of 1857; and the further sum of five hundred and forty-five dollars and forty-nine cents (\$545 49) for printing the Journals of the Council and House of Representatives for the Extra Session of 1857; and the further sum of three hundred dollars for copying and preparing sectional headings, side-notes and index to the Laws of the Regular Session of 1857; and the further sum of one thousand, six hundred and ten dollars and Territorial printing

fifty cents (\$1,610 50) for publishing the Laws of the Regular and Extra Sessions of 1857 in the Pioneer and Democrat.

**Territorial binding** Sec. 5. That the sum of nine hundred and seventy-four dollars and fifty cents (\$974 50) be and the same is hereby appropriated to Goodrich, Somers & Co. assignees of M. H. Abbott, for binding the Laws and Journals of the two houses for the Extra Session of 1857, and for the incidental binding of said session.

**Supreme court reports** Sec. 6. That the sum of three thousand five hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be appropriated to Goodrich, Somers & Co. for the publication of the Supreme Court Reports now in course of printing.

**Constitutional debates printing** Sec. 7. That the further sum of two thousand, five hundred dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated for concluding the publication of the Debates and Journals of the Constitutional Convention presided over by Hon. H. H. Sibley; and the further sum of seven thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, for the printing and publication ordered by, and incidental to the business of the Constitutional Convention presided over by, Hon. St. A. D. Balcombe.

**Incidental printing of the legislature** Sec. 8. That the sum of fifteen thousand dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the payment of the incidental printing and binding of the current session of this Legislative Assembly.

**Payment of members of the legislature** Sec. 9. That the appropriations specified in Sections one and two of this Act be paid by the Treasurer out of any moneys coming into the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, upon presentation of certificates signed by the presiding officers and attested by the Secretaries of the respective bodies named in said sections; and that all other bills and demands for which moneys are herein appropriated shall be audited by the officers appointed by law and shall be paid only on certificates being duly issued.

**Payment of the other appropriations** Sec. 10. The further sum of one hundred and five dollars to Samuel Medary, as member of the Board of Canvassers; to Joseph R. Brown, for mileage and per diem, as member of the Board of Canvassers, one hundred and forty-four dollars; to Thomas J. Galbraith, for mileage and per diem as member of the Board of Canvassers, one hundred and fifteen dollars; to Wm. F. Wheeler, for services as Secretary to the Board of Canvassers, one hundred and fifteen dollars.

**Board of canvassers** Sec. 11. The further sum of three thousand dollars is appropriated to pay the stationery and postage certificates ordered by the House and Senate of the present Legislature.

**Stationary** Sec. 12. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*

SECTION 1. The sum of twenty thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for the payment of per diem, mileage, stationary, and postages of the members and officers of the present Legislature. Legislative fund

SEC. 2. The sum of two thousand five hundred dollars is appropriated for payment of the Governor's salary for the present year, and the sum of one thousand dollars is also appropriated to the order of the Governor as an executive contingent fund for State purposes. Governor's salary and contingent fund

SEC. 3. The sum one thousand five hundred dollars is hereby appropriated for the salary of the Secretary of State for the present year. Secretary of state

SEC. 4. The sum of one thousand dollars is hereby appropriated for the payment of the salary of the Attorney General for the present year. Attorney general
