SEC. 28. Any Auditor of State or other officer, who shall violate any of the provisions of this Act, shall be liable, on conviction thereof before some competent Court, to be punished by imprisonment in the State Prison for a period of not less than one year, or more than ten years.

Sec. 29. This Act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER LXVI.

An Act Regulating the Hours of Manual Labor.

SECTION 3. Hours of labor limited to ten hours daily for women and children in factories, workshops, &c .- Penalty.

 3. Fines for violation of this Act, to go into school fund.
- 4. Act takes effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That in all manufactories, work-shops, and Tem hours a days other places used for mechanical or manufacturing purposes work for women in the State of Minnesota, where children under the age of and childreneighteen years and women are employed, the time of labor of penalty against employers for vio the persons aforesaid, shall not exceed ten hours for each lation of this act day, and any owner, stockholder, overseer, employer, clerk or foreman, who shall compel any woman or any child under eighteen years of age to labor in any day exceeding ten hours, or shall permit any child under the age of fourteen, to labor in any factory, work-shop, or other place used for mechanical or manufacturing purposes, for more than ten hours in any one day, where such owner, stockholder, overseer, employer, clerk or foreman has control, such person so offending, shall be liable to a prosecution in the name of the State of Minnesota, before any Justice of the Peace, or Court of competent jurisdiction of the county wherein the same shall occur, and upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not less than ten or more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 2. That in all engagements to labor in any mechanical or manufacturing business, a day's work, when the con-labor when there is no is no contract of labor is silent upon the subject, or when there is no is no contract express contract, shall consist of ten hours, and all agreements, contracts or engagements, in reference to such labor, shall be so construed.

SEC. 3. That whenever a fine shall be collected in accordance with the first Section of this Act, the same shall be paid over to the County Treasurer [of the county] wherein the trial may be had, and the same shall be by them disbursed for the benefit of common schools.

SEC. 4. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
