amended so as to read as follows, viz:

As a judicial officer he shall have concurrent jurisdiction powers of justices of the Peace of the County of Houston, of all lices of the cases arising out of the violation of any ordinance of said peace town; and provided he file an oath and bond as required of Justices, he may exercise both criminal and civil jurisdiction, concurrent and co-extensive with that of a Justice of the Peace of Houston County.

Szotion 1. Amendment to Chapter 18, Extra Session Laws, Section 12, providing Town officers, and for a Town election.

Be it enucted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That Section 12 of said Act be amended so as to read as follows: That so much land as is contained in the town site of Manannah, Meeker county, viz: township 121, range 31 and 32, and sections 25 and 30, be and the same is hereby created a town corporate and politic by the name of Manannah.

An Act to Incorporate the Town of Maple Lake, Wright County.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Boundaries of the town

Section 1. That so much land in township 121 north, and range 26 west, as is surveyed mapped and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of Wright county, and known as "Geneva," be and the same is hereby created a town corporate by the name of Maple Lake, with all the power, privileges and responsibilities usually enjoyed by municipal corporations.
