Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That John Ball, William Kinkead and J. H. Commissioners Barrett, be and are hereby appointed Commissioners to lay named to lay out, mark and establish a State Road, commencing at St. out road Cloud, thence by the most direct and feasible route, in their judgment, to Breckenridge, on the Red River of the North.

Sec. 2. The Commissioners aforementioned shall meet at the Stearns House, in St. Cloud, on the first of May, or at such time as they may agree upon, and proceed to survey
