

Ramsey county, all deeds, mortgages, and other evidences of titles now remaining of record in the county of Ramsey, in all cases where the lands are situated in the county of Blue Earth.

Authority to Register of Deeds of Blue Earth county to copy records from Ramsey county

SEC. 2. That the aforesaid Register of Deeds, shall be entitled to the same fees for said services, as he is entitled to by law for making original records, to be paid out of the county treasury of Blue Earth county.

Fees of Register of Deeds

SEC. 3. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER CXLIII.

*An Act to lay out and establish a State Road from Manomin in Manomin county, by way of Quaker Settlement to Cambridge in Isanti county.*

- SECTION 1. Commissioners appointed to locate a State Road from Manomin to Cambridge.
2. First meeting of Commissioners.
  3. Per diem of Commissioners.
  4. Expenses of laying out road, how paid.
  5. Statement of expenses to be filed.
  6. Commissioners to make out and file plat of Road.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*

SECTION 1. That ——— Rogers, Owen Evans and Jeddediah Kimball, be and the same are hereby appointed Commissioners to locate and establish a State Road, commencing at Manomin in Manomin county, and running from thence by way of Quaker Settlement to Cambridge in Isanti county.

Commissioners appointed to lay out a State Road from Manomin to Cambridge

SEC. 2. That said Commissioners shall meet at Manomin,

at the office of the Register of Deeds, of Manomin county, on the first Tuesday of September, A. D. 1858, or as soon thereafter as practicable, and proceed to lay out and mark said road; and in case either of the above named Commissioners neglect or refuse to act as such Commissioner, the other Commissioners may supply the vacancy by the appointment of some suitable person, who shall have the same authority as is by this act conferred upon either of said Commissioners above named.

SEC. 3. That said Commissioners shall be allowed the sum of three dollars per day, for the time necessarily occupied in the location of said road. And they are hereby empowered to employ one surveyor, at four dollars per day, and two chain-men and one axe-man at two dollars per day.

SEC. 4. That each county through which said road shall pass, shall pay the expenses incurred in the location of the same, in proportion to the length of said road in each county respectively,

SEC. 5. That a statement of said expenses so incurred, shall be made in writing by said Commissioners, which statement shall designate the amount of the same to be so paid by each of said counties, a copy of which statement shall be furnished by said Commissioners to the Board of County Commissioners of each of the said counties, and the orders of the said Road Commissioners upon the Treasurer of each of said counties respectively, for the amounts so designated, shall be by said Treasurers paid out of the moneys in the treasuries of the said counties respectively.

SEC. 6. That it is hereby made the duty of said Commissioners to make out a full plat of said road, and file a copy of the same in the office of the Register of Deeds of the several counties through which said road may pass.

SEC. 7. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
