An Act to incorporate the town of Marmata.

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SECTION 1. Boundaries of the town.
2. Corporate authorities—election every two years.
3. First election of town officers.

Appointment of first town officers.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Szorion 1. That so much land in the county of Lake, and State of Minnesota, as has been surveyed, platted and re-Boundaries corded in the office of the Register of Deeds for said county, under the name of "Marmata," be, and the same is hereby created a town corporate, by the name of Marmata, with all the powers, privileges, and responsibilities usually enjoyed by municipal corporations.

SEC. 2. That the corporate authorities of said town shall be a President and Common Council, which shall be known Corporate auas the President and Common Council of Marmata; that for thorities—electhe good order and government of said town, it shall be law-years ful, and there shall be elected every two years, a President, Secretary, and three Trustees, who shall constitute the Town Council of said town, any three of whom shall constitute a

quorum for the transaction of business. SEC. 3. That the first election of officers named in the foregoing section, shall be held on the first Monday of Octo-First election ber, A. D. 1358, or as soon thereafter as convenient; notices of town officers of such election to be posted in three public places in said town, at least fifteen days before said election.

SEC. 4. Until the first election of officers the following shall be the officers of said town, viz: for President, Robert Appointment of first town officers

Jonson; for Secretary, Vose Palmer; for Trustees, James A. Cooper, E. C. Sweet, and L. C. Palmer.

SEC. 5. This Act to take effect and be in force from and

after its passage.
