

CHAPTER CLXIII.

An Act to Incorporate the Towns of Echota and Marion.

- SECTION 1. Location and Boundaries of the Town of Echota.
 2. Designation of first Town Officers.
 3. Location and Boundaries of the Town of Marion.
 4. First Town Officers designated.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.

SECTION 1. That one mile square situated on Otter Tail River, and at the foot of Truth Lake, on said river, as surveyed by B. Densmore, be and the same is hereby created a town corporate and politic by the name and style of Echota, subject to all rights and privileges of similar town corporations, according to an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate certain towns in the Territory of Minnesota," approved May 23, A. D. 1857.

SEC. 2. That John Nininger shall be President, Joseph B. Horne shall be Recorder, and Nathan Johnson, M. Groff and James K. Hoffman shall be the Justices of said town of Echota, who shall hold their offices until their successors are elected and qualified under the Act above referred to.

SEC. 3. That one section of land situated at the southwest end of Otter Tail Lake, and lying north of Otter Tail River, as surveyed by order of the Echota and Marion Land Company, be, and the same is hereby created a town corporate and politic by the name and style of "Marion," subject to all the rights and privileges of similar town corporations, according to an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate certain towns in the Territory of Minnesota," approved May 23, A. D. 1857.

SEC. 4. That B. Densmore, shall be President, J. V. Wren, shall be Recorder, and that J. Brayton, G. Solvyne, and J. Robertson shall be the Trustees of the said town of Marion, who shall hold their offices until their successors are elected and qualified under the Act above referred to.
