Section 1. That so much land, not exceeding three hundred and twenty (320) acres, in township one hundred and twenty-two (122), north of range twenty-nine (29), west of the fifth principal meridian, as is surveyed and platted as the town site of Yarmouth, be, and the same is hereby created a town corporate by the name of Yarmouth.

Sat. 2. That for the good order and government of said Officers how town it shall be lawful, and there shall be established a elected Town Council of said town, consisting of a President, Secretary and three Trustees, who shall hold their office for one year and until their successors are elected and qualified, any three of whom shall be a quorum for the transaction of business, and that George W.
