of Pine is hereby empowered and authorized to copy from the records of the County of Chisago all deeds, mortgages, bonds, powers of attorney, bills of sale, or any instruments of agreement which have been recorded in the County of Chisago, pertaining or relating to property real or personal which is within the limits of the County of Pine.

Fees for copy-  
ing

Sec. 2. The Register of Deeds shall receive for such services the same fees as are allowed to clerks of elections in making election returns, as traveling fees, and the same for copying the instruments [named] in Section one as are allowed by law for recording the same.

Expenses how  
paid

Sec. 3. The costs of such copying and traveling fees shall be paid out of the Treasury of the County of Pine; the County Commissioners first approving of the same.

Sec. 4. This Act shall take effect from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER CLXIX.

### *An Act for the Relief of Cannon Falls School District Number eleven, of Goodhue County.*

- SECTION 1. Proceedings of School District No. 11 legalized.  
2. Trustees of School District to borrow money if so voted by the people.  
3. Authority to levy tax for the support of schools.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. All the proceedings of School District number

eleven, of Goodhue county, in its organization and in levy-<sup>Proceedings</sup> ing taxes for the erection of a school house and the support <sup>legalized</sup> of schools, are hereby legalized and the same shall have the force and effect of law, notwithstanding any irregularities which may have existed therein.

SEC. 2. The Trustees of said district, if a majority of the <sup>Trustees to bor</sup> legal voters of the same, at any legally called and organ-<sup>row money</sup> ized meeting shall so determine, are empowered to loan the credit of the district, by the issue of bonds or otherwise, for the payment of its indebtedness, and for building, purchasing, hiring or leasing suitable rooms for the use of its schools; *Provided*, The whole amount of such bonds or obligations does not exceed the sum of two thousand dollars.

SEC. 3. The district at any legal meeting, is hereby au-<sup>Authority to</sup> thorized to raise by tax, an amount sufficient to pay its <sup>levy tax</sup> indebtedness, and for the support of its schools during the current year.

SEC. 4. This Act shall take effect from and after its passage.
