### CHAPTER COXIX.

# An Act to Incorporate the Town of Redstone.

Bearing 1. Boundaries of the Town.
2. Annual election for Town Officers.
3. First election for Town Officers.
4. Corporate powers of Town Officers.

### Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Boundaries of the town

SECTION 1. That so much land as is contained in the south half section thirty-five (85), in township one hundred and ten (110), north of range No. thirty (80) west, embracing all the present town site of Redstone, as the same is platted and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of the county of Nicollet, be and the same is bereby created a town corporate by the name of Redstone, and shall have and enjoy all the powers, privileges and responsibilities usually enjoyed by municipal corporations.

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SEC. 2. That for the good order and government of said town, it shall be lawful, and there shall be elected every two years, a President, Secretary and three Trustees, who shall constitute the Town Council of said town, any three of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SEC. 3. That the first election for town officers named in the foregoing Section, shall be held on the third Monday in

August next ensuing, notices of said election to be posted in three public places in said town, at least fifteen days before said election.

SEC. 4. The President and Trustees of said town shall be a body politic and corporate with perpetual succession, to be known and designated by the name of the Town Council of Redstone, and shall possess all the rights, and be subject to all the liabilities usually belonging to municipal corporations.

SEC. 5. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
