CHAPTER LXVIII.

An Act authorizing the City of St. Paul to issue Special Bonds of the City for Certain Purposes.

SECTION 1. Authorizes City Bonds to be issued for purchase and building Markets.

2. Interest per annum and duration of bonds.

3. Credit of city pledged, and taxes authorized for payment of interest and principal.

4. Act takes effect on passage,

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. For the purpose of purchasing suitable land and buildings for a market or markets in St. Paul, the Common Council of said city are hereby authorized and empowered to issue special bonds of said city to an amount not exceeding the sum of thirty-five thousand dollars.

SEC. 2. Said bonds shall bear an annual interest not exceeding twelve per cent. per annum, said interest payable annually, in the city of New York, on the first day of August of

each and every year, and the principal of said bonds shall be payable at such time as said Common Council may determine, not exceeding fifteen years from the date thereof.

SEC. 3. Said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor of said city, and by the Clerk of said Common Council, and countersigned and registered by the Comptroller of said city, and sealed with the seal thereof; and the faith and credit of the City of St. Paul shall be pledged for the punctual payment of the principal and interest of said bonds when the same shall mature; and the Common Council of said city are hereby authorized to levy a special tax upon all the taxable property of said city not exceeding one-half of one per cent., to meet the payment of the interest and principal of said bonds. CHAPTER LXIX.

An Act to Legalize certain Acts of the Town Council of Winnebago City and Clearwater.

- SECTION 1. Certain acts of Town Councils legalized.
2. Act takes effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the acts of the Town Council of the towns of Winnebago City and Clearwater, so far as relates to the advertising and posting notices of the entry of said towns, are hereby declared legal.
