Said Directors shall choose a President, Secretary, and such other officers as the by-laws of said company may prescribe. The President shall in all cases be one of the number of said directors.

Sec. 2. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and

after its passage.

CHAPTER LXXXIX.

An Act to protect Fish in Green Lake in Chisago County.

SECTION 1. Fishing by sein or net in Green Lake is prohibited.

Penalty for violation of this Act.

3. Suits may be commenced by parties having knowledge of violation.

4. Act takes effect after September 1, 1858.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the . State of Minnesota:

SECTION I. That all persons are Lake in Chisago County, Fishing in Green Lake

SEC. 2. That any and all persons upon being convicted prohibited of a violation of the provisions of this Act, shall pay a fine penalty of not more than twenty-five (25) dollars nor less than five

(5) dollars, which fine shall be paid into the school fund in the County of Chisago.

SEC. 3. Suits may be commenced and prosecuted by any

person having knowledge of the violation of this Act.

SEC. 4. This Act shall take effect from and after the first day of September, A. D. 1858.

"SECTION 1. Amendment to Section eight, relating to the shares of capital stock, and their payment. Act takes effect on passage.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

That the eighth Section of the Act incorporating the Minneapolis Mill Company, approved February twenty-seventh, eighteen hundred and fifty-six, be amended by lons in case of adding to the end of said section the following provisions: And all shares of the capital stock of said company, issued to or holden or owned by any person or persons whatsoever, upon which any assessment or assessments shall remain unpaid after due notice of said assessment or assessments to be given in a manner and for a period prescribed in or by the by-laws of said company, may be sold by said company or its proper officer, designated by said by-laws, under such
